## FOUR NIGHTS OF FRONTIER FROLIC SOON ON IN CANYON, WITH 650,000 BUCKS TO SPEND

Happy Canyon will open its doors tomorrow evening at 7 o'clock for its four nights of frontier frolic. The stage is all set, the performers will go through their final rehearsal this evening, the directors are catching up the tag ends of their preparations and promptly at 3 o'clock tomorrow evening the opening feature of the opening night will begin. Even the picturesque scenic efforts of the last show have been surpassed this year, more attention having been given by the artists to the details. Directors Raley and Drake, who have the program in charge, have a number of new features this year which promise to add to the delight of the crowds. The sale of reserved seats indicates a packed grandstand on each of the four nights and there is not a question but that thousands will be turned away on Friday and Saturday evenings. Because it is impossible to increase the seating capacity, the directors are requesting local people insofar as possible, to attend the Wednesday and Thursday performances so that the two final evenings may be given over to visitors.

### Jazzist Orchestra Coming

The big dancing pavilion has been put in splendid condition and an effort will be made to keep the spectators from crowding onto the dancing floor. Director Bentley has secured a competent crew of helpers and, with the assistance of the jazzist orchestra in the northwest, promises to make this dance as peppy as ever a dance was.

Director Kern, who has charge of the "liquor" emporium, has made improvements at his bar and has ordered enough "red and yellow liquor" to float the Leviathan. "Wild Bill" Morrison and "Alkali Ed" Geist have their "gambling" equipment all installed and the whirl of the little ivory ball and the rattle of the bones will start as soon as the first "street" performance is over.

**650,000 Bucks to Spend.**  
Anticipating a big run on the bank, Director Rinehart has increased the capital stock of Spender's Bank and will have 650,000 Bucks ready for circulation. An addition has been built

to the bank building so that sales can be made inside the pavilion as well as in the street.

The other directors have given equal attention to their particular departments and all are rarin' to go.

## DEMANDS ON TREASURY DECLARED STAGGERING

WASHINGTON, Sept. 16.—The federal treasury already faces a deficit of \$2,591,272,345. For the present fiscal year, Chairman Good of the house appropriations committee, declared in a speech to the house today. He sounded a warning that the "actual condition confronting the treasury is so alarming that we may well pause and calmly consider the obligations already existing, that must be met before entering on an enlarged program which calls for additional expenditures." Demands on the treasury during the present fiscal year are stagger-

ing, Good said. The average peace time expenditure is slightly more than a billion. Total government requirements, outside of the present urgent deficiency bill and appropriations that will be asked for by June 30, 1920, will be \$10,831,261. Revenue for the fiscal year will be \$7,239,923, said Good.

Good strongly recommended that President Wilson appoint a national finance officer to have complete oversight of all government expenditures so that economy may be practiced to the limit by the government. Good called upon the president to use his authority to produce the strictest governmental economy.

### OFFICERS ARE LOYAL

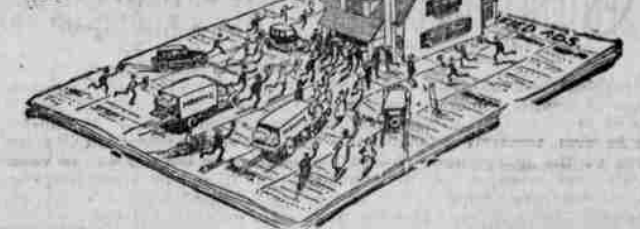
