HOOD RIVER ADVOCATES OF PEACE SENT PETITION TO OREGON SENATORS

HOOD RIVER, Oct. 8.—At the suggestion of the Oregon branch of the league to enforce peace the Hood River Glacier have secured the co-operation of 23 influential citizens in asking Senators Chamberlain and McNary to support an early ratification of the peace treaty including the covenant for the league of nations without amendment. The petitioners do not oppose interpretative clauses for

clarifying the language of the covenant.

While no extensive campaign was made to secure signatures to the petition, the sentiment of Hood River was shown to be largely in favor of an early ratification of the treaty. Yet the district is by no means unanimous. Six citizens expressed unqualified opposition to the document, and more than a dozen voiced indetermination.

MURDERER, 17, USED HAMMER; SENTENCED TO PRISON GALLOWS

BAKERSFIELD, Cal., Oct. 8.—Roy Wolff, aged 17, who was convicted of the murder of Elmer E. Greer, Taft rent car driver, who was killed with a hammer, today was sentenced by Judge Howard A. Pairs to be hanged at San Quentin. Attorneys for the defendant gave notice of appeal from Judge Pairs' motion, denying Wolff a new trial. Wolff, whose home is in Yakima, Wash., went through the ordeal without flinching. He was apparently the coolest one in the courtroom, which was partly filled. Wolff testified that he has six brothers and three sisters and that he was preparing to be a machinist.

NEW YORK, Oct. 8.—Sixty employees of the Bank of the United States, members of the Bank Employees' union, walked out yesterday when officials of the institution refused to recognize their union and reinstate a discharged union employee. The strikers declare that the union has enrolled more than 2000 members since its organization last month.

33,065 ARMY MEN STILL ACROSS SEA

WASHINGTON, Oct. 8.—The strength of the army as reported for September 23 showed 33,065 officers and men in Europe, 8400 in Siberia, 7600 at sea en route home and 394,000 in the United States. After October 31 an average strength of 255,000 will be maintained.

ROMAN PRESS EXPLAINS FIUME ATTITUDE SAYING WILSON'S MIND DERANGED

ROME, Oct. 8.—Commenting bitterly regarding the allies' attitude in the Fiume situation, both the Idea Nazionale and the Tribuna newspapers profess to believe that President Wilson is suffering from derangement. "We have been judged badly at the conference since hitherto the only opposition comes from a man who is mentally deranged," said the Idea Nazionale. The Tribuna said: "The fault regarding Fiume not only is the Italians, but also the allies who blindly followed the suggestions of a high personage not free from human weakness and who is now suffering from serious derangement of the nervous system which perhaps explains the hitherto inexplicable points in President Wilson's handling of the Adriatic question."

HUSBAND WHO MARRIED "WIDOW" SEEKS RELEASE WHEN SOLDIER COMES

PORTLAND, Oct. 8.—A returned overseas veteran, who had been reported killed in action, caused a suit for annulment to be filed in the circuit court Saturday by Cash R. Lane from Margaret Lane. The dead man turned up very much alive and Lane, who married his wife, March 1, 1919, under the impression that the soldier was actually killed, immediately commenced suit for annulment.
