CITIZENSHIP.

SEVENTEEN applicants for American citizenship are today listed on the roll for hearing on January 10. Some of these are up for their first time while a few have appeared for their final papers at various times since January 11, 1919. The class now listed has 90 days in which to make final preparation for receiving citizenship. Will the usual 50 per cent or more be rejected, as has been the case of late?

American citizenship is a rare gift. Too many who have applied have found that they consider it all too lightly. Numerous candidates have come before the court for final papers exhibiting woeful ignorance of the constitution, laws, language and customs of the United States. Among those rejected have been several to whom English is the native tongue. All who apply, must prove five years continuous residence in the United States, yet some know less of the necessary information than could be learned by a bright Oriental in five months.

The United States is requiring of its would-be citizens a much higher standard than before the recent war. There is no excuse for an applicant's being unprepared, inasmuch as there are so many means open to him for learning those things required of him. The county library or any public school teacher will give the information desired. The latter are bound by their contracts to assist a candidate for citizenship in civics, reading and writing. They will coach an applicant in the constitution and interpret its various clauses. Americans want more Americans and want them to be good Americans. The applicant who is rejected at his final hearing has only himself to blame.

ROOSEVELT.

A MONUMENT to Americanism; a memorial to the twentieth century's greatest American, Theodore Roosevelt. Such is the two-fold purpose of the Roosevelt Memorial campaign which occupies the week beginning next Monday and ending Monday, October 27, anniversary of Roosevelt's birth.

Great men of America who have been honored thus far in the history of their nation have been remembered for their deeds. The honor for Roosevelt is for his creed. Roosevelt is held up as the typical American, the forceful, vigorous man combining the qualities of statesman, journalist, commentator, naturalist and sportsman. The monument which Roosevelt himself left with his death was his vigorous Americanism. He was a fighter who had convictions and fought for them. He was a man with many friends and plenty of enemies, because he did not go half way

on anything. Umatilla county is to be asked to contribute \$1750 toward the monument which will be erected in honor of Roosevelt. It is fitting that this county should have a share in the campaign for funds and, because of the following the colonel had in this county, Umatilla is looked to once again to meet its quota quickly and fully.

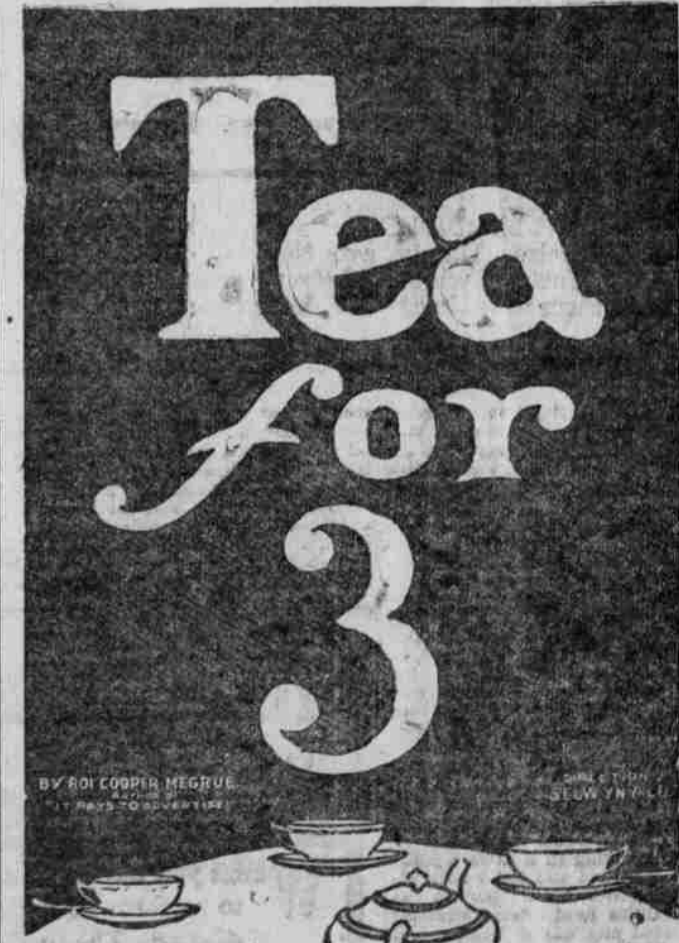

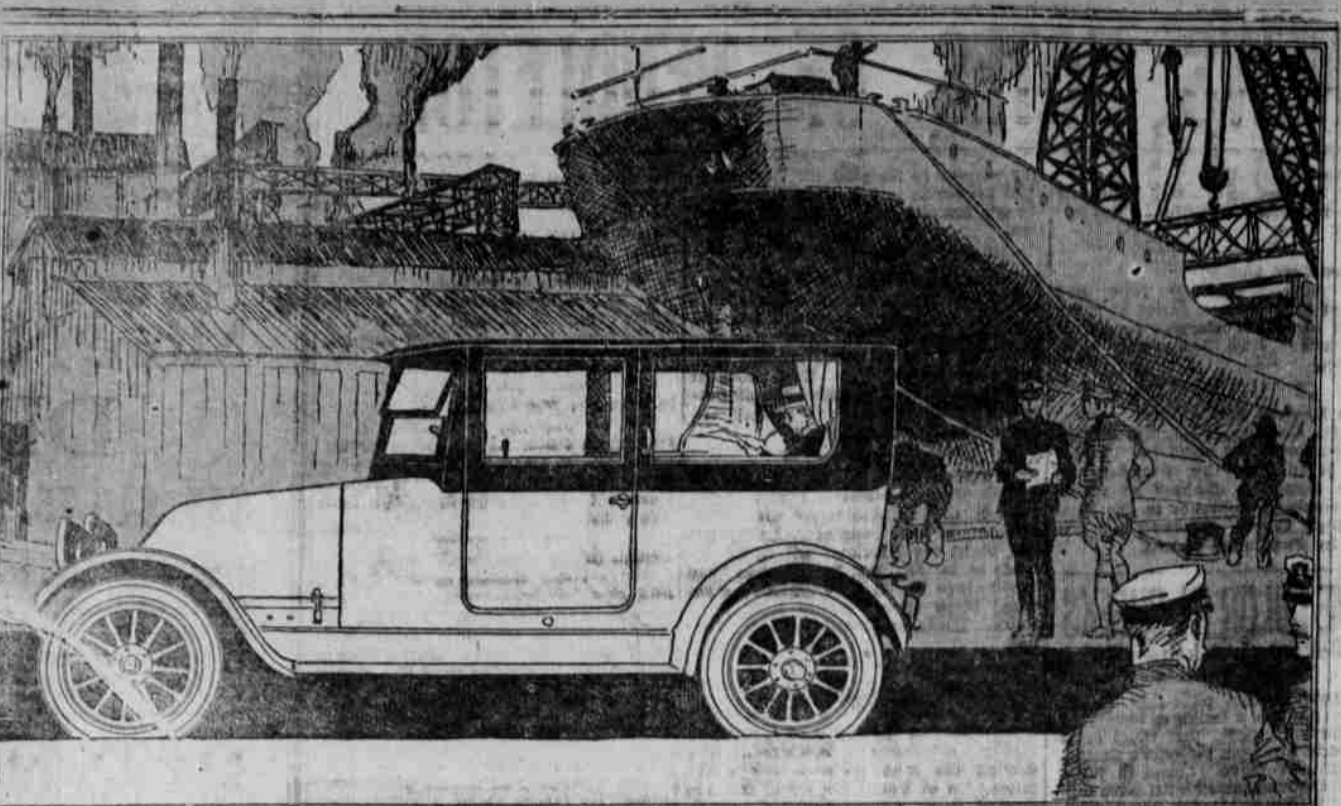
