The trip to Hermiston Saturday night is intended to show the west enders that Pendleton appreciates the development made in stock raising and dairying. The livestock exhibits open Wednesday and continue until

Friday night. The convention of the State Dairyman's Association takes place Saturday, closing with a monster pheasant banquet at which the Hermiston Commercial Club is host. They want to know by Thursday whether to save 100 plates at \$1 each for Pendleton's delegation.

Lists are being circulated today by C. K. Crunston, secretary of the Commercial Association, among those who will attend the banquet. He and Mr. Nelson are also enlisting the automobiles of several members of the association and are confident that they can put over both trips in fine style.

The meeting of the managers last night was devoted to the plan of reviving all the commercial organizations in the county and then bringing them all together in a close bond of harmony. Mr. Branwell and Mr. Crunston yesterday visited Athena and received promise of immediate action. In a conference with B. E. Richards, formerly secretary of their commercial club, he expressed belief that Athena could revive an organization and make it a live factor in the com-

munity. Mr. Richards, as well as other men who were interviewed, declared that they believed in the movement and gave promise of their best efforts.

The central theme behind the proposed trips to the county towns is co-operation. Considerable discussion was held last evening regarding the necessity of the interest on the part of local businessmen.
