WAGNER, CRACKSMAN, DENIES AID IN \$10,000 ROBBERY AT ASTORIA

Full Confession Made by "Dutch Frank, Three Minute Safe Man" Testifying to Defend Alleged Accomplice.

ASTORIA, Or., Oct. 22.—Frank Wagner, alias Frank Barnett, alias "Dutch Frank, the three-minute safe man," is the self-confessed burglar who, on the night of August 15, blew the safe in Walter Kallunki's store in this city and obtained \$10,000 in gold, currency and liberty bonds.

Wagner made a full confession of the crime when he appeared in Justice of the Peace Carney's court last night as a witness for the defense in the case against Albert Meadors, who is also charged with being implicated in the case.

"I did the job and I did it alone," said Wagner. "I watched Kallunki leave the store shortly before 11 o'clock that night and then I went to work. I waded through the water to reach the basement of the building and got the safe open. After I pulled out the job, I went back and got a pair of pants, some shoes and a vest so as

to have dry clothes."

Replies Arouse Laughter.

The most of Wagner's story was told on cross-examination and some of his answers raised a ripple of laughter among the audience. "You are a pretty good cracksmen, are you not?" asked Attorney Fulton.

"Didn't you see some of my work?" came back the reply with a snap.

"Yes, but I wondered why you bored so many holes in the floor and partition and I supposed some one helped you," said the attorney.

"No one helped me, there was no one watching on the outside and I bored the holes to get through because to break partitions makes too much noise," was the answer.

Continuing, Wagner told his story in answer to questions as follows: "I met Meadors when we were both serving time in the penitentiary, but had not seen him for more than a year until I met him in Astoria shortly before noon Sunday, August 17, two days after the robbery. He had absolutely nothing to do with the robbery and was not in Astoria at that time.

"Tip Denied By Robber.
"No one gave me a tip about Kallunki's store. I just took a chance, but I didn't expect to get over \$200 or \$400. I used common dynamite to blow the door and I never counted the money. I didn't care enough about it.

"After the robbery I walked under the roadway for a long distance, then changed my clothes, hid the principal part of the money and, coming into the roadway, walked into town. I met a motorcycle cop on the way.

That afternoon I went back and brought the balance of the money and liberty bonds in a satchel."

Asked if he had spent the whole \$5,000 that was stolen, Wagner said, "It was mine. I paid for it by serving five years in the penitentiary. You didn't find much of it on me, did you? It was all spent except what you have and \$180 of that belongs to Meadors. He won't shoot me. I have no use for them in my line. The heavy satchel you inquire about contained something more dangerous than burglar's tools. There were six quarts of whisky in it."

ly to the productiveness of units now in use.

"In view of the further possible development from such other supplies as the John Day river, Umatilla county certainly has a bright future," Judge King said. "The projects already in operation have exceeded the brightest hopes first held out for them. There are yet many thousands acres in the county which can do as well. The success of the reclaimed areas in Umatilla county is assured. The thing now is to get funds for development."

Encourages Private Building

While government aid is probable

for the McKay dam and reservoir, the Teel district is privately owned. It is not decided whether the John Day project will be taken over by the government. "The government is encouraging privately built reclamation systems, Judge King explained, for the reason that with only limited funds available, one government and one private system might be built, whereas, with nothing but government capital, probably neither could be started. Judge King and his colleagues came to Hermiston Tuesday to confer with the directors of the west extension of the Hermiston government project regarding a contract between the district and the service. This pertains to projects already in operation and has to do with changing from the water users' system to the district system. No physical changes are contemplated, the proposal merely having required legal advice.

The new Oregon law guaranteeing interest payments on approved irrigation projects for the first five years and a similar law in Washington guaranteeing payments for four years will bring quicker action on reclamation projects in these states than in any others, Judge King said recently. The Chamberlain-Smith bill, if passed, would result in the reclamation of about 1,000,000 acres of arid, stump and swamp lands in Oregon alone, the judge believes.
