**180,000,000 Fewer Hens in World Today.**  
 Experts who have been studying the shortage of eggs estimate that there are 180,000,000 fewer hens in the world now than there were just before the war. England used to import 200,000 tons of eggs yearly, but because of the shortage is able to buy only 40,000 to 50,000 tons.

**Grain Market Affected by Killing of Treaty.**  
 Failure of the senate and house to confirm the peace treaty had a serious effect upon grain values at all American points during the day, especially in the coarse stock for export.

European orders for American cereals were reported cancelled in some quarters, because of this action and while values have not shown any remarkable break, the situation is far from being favorable.
