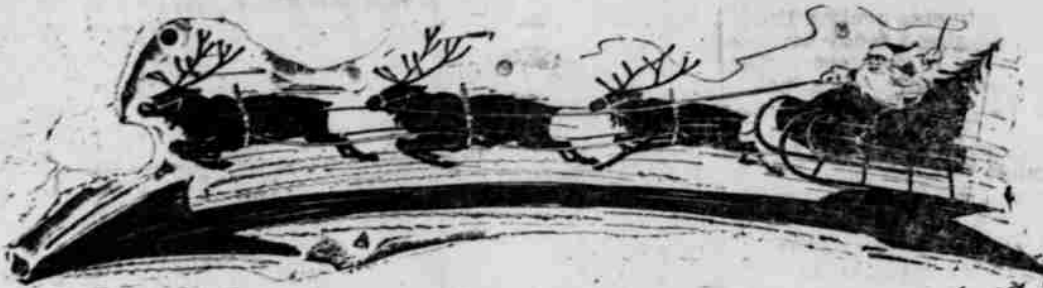

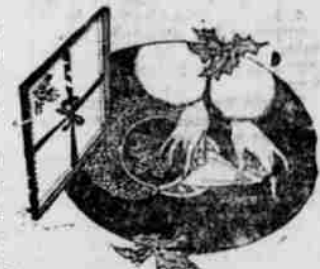

Christ Drougas, of Umatilla, today denied the report sent out from that place recently, that he was being held by federal officials on a bootlegging charge. The story, which was dated Nov. 19, named Drougas as the man wanted, but he says it is a case of mistaken identity. He claims to have been in Portland since October 25. Drougas was a car repair man for the O.-W. railroad there for eight years and is now starting in the restaurant business there.

AGED PRISONER BECOMES DYNAMO OF NEW ENERGY

SAN QUENTIN PRISON, Cal., Dec. 29.—The aged prisoner J., who, several weeks ago was given the infernal glands of Tom Bellow, who was executed, today appealed to the prison surgeon for relief. He complained that while his physical health is greatly improved he is inconvenienced by other symptoms. Dr. Kelker, who performed the gland operation, prescribed for J., He said J.'s case is the most remarkable of 10 on record at the prison. J. was first to receive the double gland implantation. His vitality increased to such an extent that it became necessary to "apply the brakes." He is a dynamo of energy. It is feared that his confinement within the prison walls may work a hardship on the rejuvenated man.

ZOOLOGY MUSEUM GIVEN FINE EGG COLLECTION

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, EUGENE

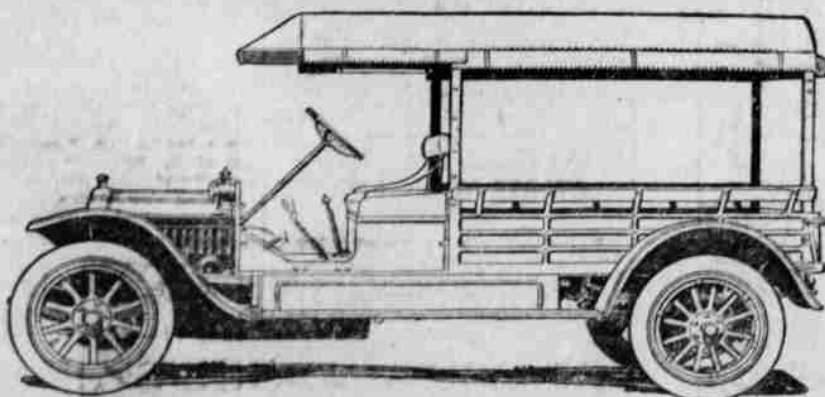
GENE, Dec. 1.—Thirty-five sets of birds' eggs, together with the nests, were presented to the zoology museum of the University of Oregon recently by Dr. A. G. Prill, a physician of Seilo, Oregon, who was one of the first to begin collecting in Oregon, having started in the early 'eighties. Dr. Prill had formerly collected for the Smithsonian Institute at Washington, D. C., and for the Golden Gate Park museum in San Francisco. The Prill collection is particularly valuable because the eggs were sent in their native nests. The museum possesses one other collection of eggs known as the Schmidt collection. This contains 75 sets of eggs, but does not have the nests. These collections are of especial value to the students who are studying animal distribution, and advanced students in the zoology department.
