ALLIES WILL ADVANCE IF GERMANY REFUSES

LONDON, Dec. 6.—The allies intend to occupy Frankfurt and Essen if Germany refuses to accept the protocol of the peace treaty, a Paris dispatch today declares.

STATE SUFFERS 1745 ACCIDENTS IN MONTH, ELEVEN PROVE FATAL

SALEM, Dec. 6.—A total of 1745 accidents, of which 11 were fatal, were reported to the state industrial accident commission during November, according to the monthly report of the commission. With a total of 2283 claims disposed of during the month, or 644 in excess of the claims received, there were only 766 claims left in the course of adjustment at the end of November, as compared to a total of 2921 claims clamoring for attention at the end of September, just before the installation of the present system for speeding up compensation, inaugurated by Commissioner Will T. Kirk in the two months during which the new system has been in

operation the number of claims pending has been reduced by 1257 over the number of claims received in the same period. The new system assures the prompt dispatch of all claims for injuries presented to the commission and will prevent any accumulation of claims, as was experienced in the past. Receipts for the month totalled \$215,948.58, with disbursements aggregating \$152,452.89.

"SLEEPS" 36 DAYS, RECOGNIZES MOTHER BUT CANNOT SPEAK

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 6.—After being "asleep" for 36 days, Robert Carr, 18, recognized his mother at the hospital yesterday when she opened his eyelids. He was unable to speak to her, however.
