Marriage licenses were issued to three couples late yesterday afternoon and today. Cyril C. Conklin and Mabel D. Peterson, of Pendleton, were licensed Friday afternoon and married by Rev. W. H. Cox. Karl E. Stewart and Mrs. Mary B. Spencer of Stanfield, were issued their license this morning and were to be married today. Frederick J. Greer, and Miss Eunice Wiley, both of Weston, were issued their license today and will be wedded at Weston tomorrow.

Desertion is Ground for Complaint.
Oral C. Weaver today filed suit against Minnie Weaver for divorce on the grounds of desertion. They were married August, 1913, and she left him in January 1915, he alleges.

Cruelties Alleged by Woman.
Granville P. Holshe is alleged a gambler, inveterate smoker of cigarettes, a squanderer of money and cruel and inhuman to a complaint for divorce filed today by Mrs. Elsie Ella Holshe. She asks that her name be restored to that of a former marriage, Monahan.

County Basketball Schedule Out.
A schedule of basketball games between 10 high schools in the county was issued today by County Superintendent W. W. Green. League 1 includes Echo, Hermiston and Pilot Rock and they are to arrange their contests between January 16 and 30. Helix, Weston and Athena comprise league 2, and Milton, Ferndale and Umapine league 3. Felix meets Weston on Jan. 16 and Feb. 6 and meets Athena on Jan. 20 and Feb. 20. Weston meets Athena on Jan. 23 and Feb. 13. Milton meets Ferndale on Jan. 16 and Feb. 6. Umapine on Jan. 23 and Feb. 20 and Umapine meets Ferndale on Jan. 30 and Feb. 13. Winners of these districts will draw lots to see which plays Pendleton. The two remaining play an elimination contest and the contest for the championship of the county will result.

Commissioners Draw Resolutions.
Had resolution for the rights of the road from Pendleton to Calhoun Hill and from Rieth to Echo were drawn this afternoon by the county commissioners. Insofar as they are concerned with the close matters of controversy on these locations and any change will have to be made by action through the proper channels.

RECORD SUM PAID OUT BY COUNTY TREASURY

Umatilla county's treasury paid out the largest sum in history during the month of November, according to the report of Miss Grace A. Gilliam, filed with the county clerk today. Warrants totaling \$372,038.23 were drawn during the month.

The largest item was \$190,555.50 from the county road bond fund. This went for work on the Oregon-Washington highway between Pendleton and the state line and for the Old Oregon Trail between Rieth and the Morrow county line. The state highway commission drew about \$150,000 and \$40,000 went to the road to the east end.

The second half of the state tax, amounting to \$68,159.50, was sent to O. P. Hoff, state treasurer. This was the record largest item paid. Tied irrigation district moneys, which are kept by the county treasurer, were disbursed in the sum of \$27,663.06. County school districts took \$25,594.45 from the county school funds.

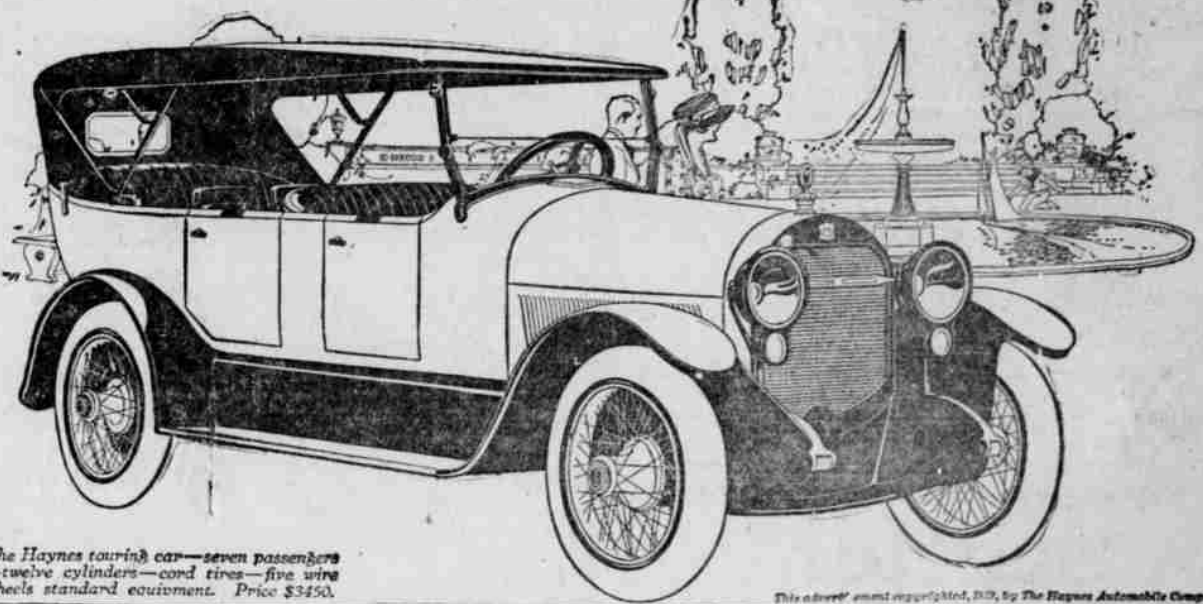

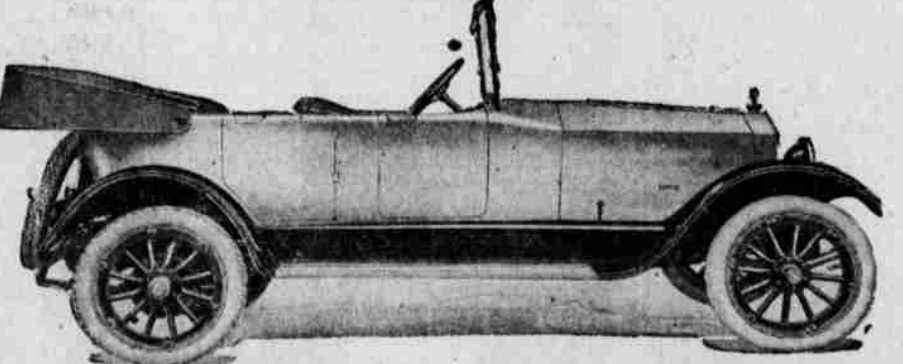
