

## BAKER LUMBER MILL SHUTS DOWN DUE TO SHORTAGE OF CARS

Eccles Co. Paralyzed, Remainder of Industry Must Follow Unless Relief, Unlikely in Coal Crisis, Comes Today.

BAKER, Dec. 11.-Baker's lumber industry entered a state of paralysis Tuesday when the Eccles Lumber mpany ceased operation at noon and e remaining three mills announced at their plants will close within the text two or three days unless relief from the car shortage arrives today. Local railway officials said that, in view of the storm and coal situation, no such relief is probable.

The Stoddard Lumber company, whose planer had been closed two days for repairs will be unable to resume operations Wednesday morning as intended. The Eaker white pine planer wil iclose Wednesday, and the Oregon Lumber company reports that, by loading platforms and sheds already
