IRATE WOMAN CHASES DRIVER FOR TWO HOURS

PORTLAND, Dec. 11.—Determined to find out the name of the man who was driving the automobile that collided with her machine at Ninth and Prescott streets about 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon, Mrs. A. E. Dignan, 1173 Union Avenue, followed the other machine around the city for nearly two hours when she was unable to learn the license number because no tag was displayed.

After a chase through Sellwood, Irvington, Montavilla and across the river, Mrs. Dignan called on a crowd of eight motorcyclists on a pleasure ride out the Terwilliger boulevard to help her stop the fleeing autoist. The motorcycle riders drove up on either side of the machine, forming a wedge in front and forcing him to a stop.

Escorted by the impromptu police, the man was conducted to the police station, where he said his name is J. R. Imbler of Hillsboro. He was formally arrested by Patrolman O'Halloran, on charges of failing to render assistance and violating the Oregon motor vehicle law. He was released on a cash bond of \$100. Neither machine was greatly damaged in the collision.

Mrs. Dignan said that Imbler refused to give his name after the accident, claiming that she had struck his machine and that he only had to report if he was responsible for the collision. He stated that he had just bought his machine and had not got a license yet. Mrs. Dignan said that whenever she would drive her machine close enough to call to Imbler, he would speed up. Several times she attempted to call a policeman, but was unable to do so for fear of losing sight of the other machine.
