Stock Sale to Be Held At Twin Falls Soon.
The Twin Falls north side breeders have announced a sale of pure-bred stock to be held in Twin Falls January 19-23. The sale will include some of the finest stock in this part of the

country. There will be 165 head of Scotch and Scotch top Shorthorns offered for the first three days of the sale, which includes 145 cows, heifers and 20 bulls. Twelve of the bulls are of Scotch blood of outstanding breeding. Much of the stock offered is from such great sires as Cumberland, Pride of Oakdale and Avondale.

Milk Cows Bring Big Price in Washington.
Thirty-one head of milk cows brought an average of \$152 each, 17 two-year-olds, fresh and coming fresh, averaged \$103, and 23 yearlings averaged \$45 each at an auction sale of Holstein cattle held at the Adna farm of Harvey Shoultz, near Chehalis yesterday. The prices are regarded as most satisfactory and indicative of the strong condition of the market for cattle of the popular milking strain.

Wheat in Butte Creek Vicinity Looks Well.
Wheat in the Butte Creek vicinity is reported looking well and doing well, according to reports from Echo. There is more moisture in the soil than there has been at this time of year for many seasons and the crop has not suffered from cold so far.

Price of Butter Lower in Portland.
According to prices quoted in Pendleton markets, the price of butter is higher in Pendleton than in Portland. Butter retails here for 80 cents a pound, while in Portland it retails for from 73 cents to 75 cents a pound since the recent drop in price. Grocers give as the reason for the higher price the fact that when the wholesale price of butter went up some time ago, they absorbed the increase.

Cattle Strengthens; Hogs Steady at \$15.25.
Cattle showed a reversal of form and are now strong and higher at North Portland. Hogs are steady while there was nothing available to test the sheep and lamb trade. Top steers are now quoted up to \$11.75. General cattle market range: Best steers \$11.00@11.75. Good to choice cows and heifers 7.75@9.00.
