Swiftly the quarrel expands, like the ripples from a pebble thrown in a lake and soon they are divorced.

DEAD AT VERA CRUZ ESTIMATED AT 300

MEXICO CITY, Jan. 8.—Unofficial estimates placed on the total dead in Saturday night's earthquake in 300. The state of Vera Cruz, which apparently felt the greatest force of the quake. Relief trains are being rushed into the stricken area, which centers around Jalapa. The discovery of additional bodies in Jalapa will bring the total dead there to 100. It is estimated.

MEXICO CITY, Jan. 8.—The number of dead as a result of Saturday night's earthquake is increasing as the removal of debris reveals additional bodies buried in the ruins of houses and buildings, according to a Jalapa dispatch. 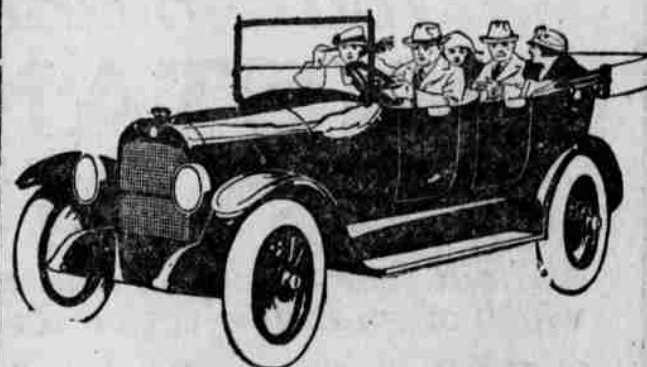
