Athena Library Report for 1919.
By the County Librarian.

Annual reports of the Umatilla county branch libraries are beginning to arrive at the central library. The first was received on January 3rd from the Athena library and includes some interesting points which might serve well as a standard of comparison for other public libraries in cities of many times the size of Athena. The population of Athena is 150 according to the last census.

The library is open two afternoons a week and the six members of the library board take entire charge of the work in turn, thus keeping up a live interest in the public library and also reducing the expense of employing a librarian. The city council has willingly financed the library and has offered to do much better as soon as a library building can be secured.

During 1919 the library was open 96 days with an average of 58 books checked out per day. During the entire month of January the library was closed for influenza quarantine or the total circulation would have been fully 600 more than the report shows.

At this time also, the Athena library sustained a very great loss in the death of Mrs. Homer L. Wairs, who, since the organization of the library in 1914 has been one of its most active and enthusiastic supporters.

Cost of the Library.
The amount paid by the city of Athena for the local maintenance of its library facilities is given below. This costs the city an average of less

than five cents per book circulated and could not possibly be accomplished without close co-operation and support of county and city in the county system.

The Athena library also gave an annual library ball, the proceeds of which were \$52.16 in 1919. The fiction rental collections amounted to \$56.75 of which \$71.96 has so far been spent for new books. The members of the library board are Mrs. Ida Del, president; Mrs. R. A. Thompson, vice president; Mrs. Ann Littlejohn, secretary; Mrs. Jessie Le Grow, Mrs. Adelle McEwen and Miss Laura McIntyre.
