For Middle-Aged Men and Women

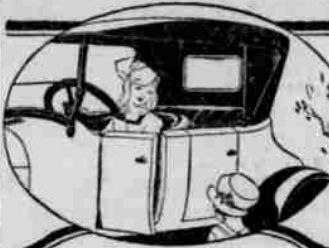
