Eggs and Poultry

Eggs, \$1.00 @ 25c. Hens, 4 to 20c. Chickens, 20c a pound. Country Ham, Etc. Ham, best quality, 28c. Bacon, best quality, 40c. Butter Fat and Butter. Butter, \$1.25 @ \$1.35.

Coarse Grain Prices

Show Market Is Steady. Coarse grain prices today showed a fairly steady tone with former bids about holding all around. Corn is being noted. For immediate delivery \$1.19 is asked and for future \$1.20. Barley remains at \$1.00 and \$1.10 and \$1.20 with oats at \$1.10 and \$1.20. Mill feed is bid at \$42.50 a ton.

Best Potatoes Retail at 4 Cents a Pound. The best Yakima potatoes, No. 1, U. S. graded, are retailing for 6 cents a pound. Inferior qualities are selling at lower prices.

Fruits Retailing in Local Markets

Red Emperor grapes are selling in Pendleton markets at 20 cents a pound. Japanese oranges are 45 cents a dozen. Florida grapefruit retail at 20 cents each or three for 50 cents. Eastern cranberries are 25 cents a pound. Apples, including the Delicious, Winesap, white winter Pearmain and Roman Beauties, range in price from \$2.75 to \$4 a box.

Price of Butter Is Lower Today

The price of butter dropped today from 80 cents a pound to 75 cents a pound. Eggs are still retailing at 75 cents a dozen.

Prices Quoted on Vegetables in Markets.

Tomatoes, from California, are retailing at 30 cents a pound. Sweet potatoes are two pounds for 25 cents. Celery, from California is 20 cents a bunch. Fanny head lettuce retails at 15 cents a head, while hot house lettuce is 50 cents a pound. Cauliflowers retail at from 25 to 50 cents a head. Carrots and parsnips sell for four pounds for 25 cents. Three pounds for 25 cents is the price for turnips. Green peppers are 50 cents a pound. French artichokes retail at 25 cents each.

Cold Weather Said to Have Injured Grain.

Cold weather is injuring both fall sown wheat and alfalfa in the northern part of Baker county, according to Albert Tozier of Hood River, who is enumerating the census in the northern districts. Mr. Tozier reports that the wheat acreage thus far is small, but that where not well covered by snow, even that which has been planted appears to have been touched by frost. Alfalfa plants, he says, have been lifted several inches by the frost and the roots are so exposed that serious damage is probable. In his

Hogs touched a new high mark for recent weeks at North Portland when early sales were shown at an advance of 25c to \$16 for extreme top stuff.

In the face of the increased price and demand at North Portland for hogs, a weaker tone was generally shown in the hog Eastern centers, with value sliding.

BRITAIN WILL INVADE U. S. IN TRADE BATTLE

LONDON, Jan. 11.—The British government is planning a great overseas trade offensive, declared Sir Hamar Greenwood, head of the department of overseas trade, in the course of an interview today in which he outlined the scheme. It includes sending of touring trade exhibitions to South Africa, Australia, New Zealand and Canada.

Sanction for the plan has already been received from the treasury department, Sir Hamar said, and it was proposed also to send similar exhibitions to South America and the United States.

He considered that 1920 promised

to be the greatest year in the history of British trade, barring strikes. He added, "We desire to strike a blow at the fetish of German cheapness, fostered by the Leipzig Fair."
