WHEREAS, the City Surveyor of the City of Pendleton did on the 17th day of December, 1919, under direction by resolution of the Common Council, file in the office of the Recorder of the City of Pendleton, plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of the following named street in said city:

Matlock street from the north line of Haley street to north line of Jackson street, together with the estimate of the cost of such work, and the probable cost thereof with a statement of the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement and the percentage of the total cost of improvement, which each of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land should pay on account of the benefits to be derived from such improvements, and

WHEREAS, the council has examined such plans and specifications and estimates and found the same satisfactory and in accordance with the provisions of the City Charter, and the City Surveyor has recommended that the same be included within the boundaries of the district benefited in the judgment of the Common Council, and that the same be included within such improvement district and that the same be included therein, and

WHEREAS, the improvement of the hereinabove described portions of Matlock street with Gravel Bitulithic pavement is at this time necessary, therefore be it

RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Pendleton, that it is expedient to improve and it is hereby proposed to improve Matlock street by paving the same with Gravel Bitulithic pavement, and that the same be included within such improvement district and that the same be included therein, and

RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Pendleton, that it is expedient to improve and it is hereby proposed to improve Matlock street by paving the same with Gravel Bitulithic pavement, such pavement to be constructed and the surface thereof to be finished upon the established grade of said street and the street to have curbs and gutters and all other things in accordance with and as shown in the plans and specifications for the improvement of said portions of Matlock street, prepared by E. B. Hayes, City Surveyor, filed with the Recorder of said city on the 17th day of December, 1919, which plans and specifications are hereby particularly referred to and adopted, approved, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the engineer's estimates of the probable total cost of such improvement, which said City Engineer's estimates were made and prepared by E. B. Hayes, City Surveyor of said city, in the sum of \$3515.75, and was filed with the Recorder of said city on the 17th day of December, 1919, be and they are hereby adopted and approved, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien upon all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land and so especially benefited by such improvement shall be liable for payment of the costs thereof, and be it further

RESOLVED, that an Assessment District be hereby created to be known as "Assessment District No. 74," embracing the property benefited and to be

assessed for the payment of such improvements, which Assessment District shall include all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows:

Assessment District No. 74.
