NEWS OF THE COUNTY OFFICES AND OFFICERS

Jayne Gets \$2197 Judgment.

By an order signed in circuit court today, H. C. Jayne, plaintiff, is awarded a judgment for \$2197 with interest from July 3, from Alex McKenzie. The case went by default.

Settle Case Out of Court.

The case of Sommers vs. Bolan, which was set for trial today in the circuit court, was settled by a stipulation between the attorneys before the case was called. The stipulation is that the defendant pay the plaintiff's attorneys \$100 and that the plaintiff receive \$50 more than one-half the proceeds from the sale of an Allen engine. As a result of the settlement there was no jury business in the circuit court today.

Weidert Must Pay Debt.

Peter Weidert must pay Smith Bros., of Helix, \$1065.52 for goods and merchandise advanced to his brother-in-law, Charles Fenn, according to the verdict of the circuit court jury last evening. The verdict gives the plaintiff the full amount asked for. Mr. Weidert was alleged by the plaintiffs to have agreed to stand for Mr. Fenn's bills, but the latter disappeared and left a number of debts unpaid.

U. S. IS SHORT 40,000 PHYSICAL EDUCATORS

NEW YORK, Jan. 16.—There is a shortage of nearly 40,000 men and women physical education teachers for pupils from 6 to 20 years of age in the schools of the country, according to a report made Thursday to the American Physical Education association by Dr. J. H. McCurdy, of Springfield, Mass., the secretary. One thousand new men teachers and 1,500 women teachers are demanded each year, he said, but the need is only partly met and the shortage continues to increase.

Physical inefficiency is responsible, Dr. McCurdy said, for the average loss of nine days to each year by the country's 20,000,000 wage earners, representing a loss of \$675,000,000 in wages and \$180,000,000 for cost of treatment.

YOUTH HIDES DIAMOND INSIDE HOLLOW TOOTH

CHICAGO, Jan. 16.—When policemen who had arrested him on a charge of stealing a diamond last night, ordered Robert Farney, 16 years old, to "rough up," he complied, literally. He had hidden the diamond in a hollow tooth.

WOOD ALCOHOL PROVES FATAL TO OAKLANDER

OAKLAND, Cal., Jan. 16.—Edward Farrington, a moulder, died from wood alcohol poisoning at the emergency hospital today despite desperate efforts made by physicians to save his life. Farrington was found in an unconscious condition in a pool hall at 2317 East Fourteenth street and was arrested for drunk. At the hospital his actual condition was determined.

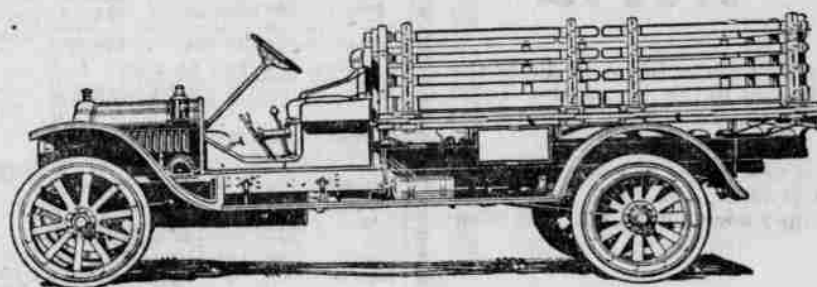
