SMALL POX EPIDEMIC IS THREATENING BAKER; FIVE ARE QUARANTINED

Disease Breaks Out in Varied Localities and Attempts to Conceal Presence Forces Health Officer to Post Orders

BAKER, Jan. 16.—Dr. J. W. Huff is being kept busy watching cases of eruptive diseases that are reported to be threatening an epidemic in Baker, and already five cases of smallpox have been revealed. Four families were under quarantine today and one patient is in the city pest house.

Dr. Huff said this afternoon that instances of attempts to conceal the presence of the disease in several houses have come to his notice, and he believes that this has caused the

increase in the number of cases, which he says, however, are not restricted to one locality. The authorities are requiring that all cases of eruptive fevers be reported to the city health officer who will determine whether the disease is chickenpox or smallpox.

AMERICAN LEAVES TO PICK UP BROKEN CORD IN BERLIN DIPLOMACY

PARIS, Jan. 16.—W. Loris Drouot, American commissioner to Germany, will leave for Berlin tonight. When he arrives in Berlin diplomatic communication will be resumed with Germany, simultaneously with England, France and Italy.

STEAMER THOUGHT LOST, IS SAFE, SAYS RADIO

LONDON, Jan. 16.—The Italian steamer Principessa Mafalda, which was reported Saturday to have foundered in a storm, is safe and proceeding toward the Canary Islands, according to a wireless message received today.

COMMERCIAL CLUB OF HELIX LAUNCHES DRIVE FOR COMMUNITY HOUSE

Sentiment Unanimous for Erection of \$6000 Building and Committees Begin Soliciting City for Funds.

The Helix Commercial Club has started a campaign for a community building whose cost is estimated at about \$6000. It is intended that the building be suitable for all public gatherings and sentiment at the last meeting of the club was unanimous for the move.

Committees to solicit funds for the community house were appointed and are already at work in and about the city. H. F. Rose and Charles Alspach are the town committeemen, Carl Engdahl is chairman and represents the district north of town; LeRoy Penland represents the district south; Rudolph Leisinger represents the district west and Archie McIntyre the district east.

DEMAND FOR KANSAS WITH 500 ACCUSED COUNTRYMEN LOOMS

PARIS, Jan. 16.—A demand upon Holland for extradition of the former Kaiser is imminent, the matins today declared. A list of 500 accused Germans, including the former crown prince, will be handed to Germany within a fortnight, the newspaper said with demands that Germany deliver the accused to allied military leaders in the Rhine provinces.

It is understood Lloyd George has abandoned his policy demanding expulsion of the Turkish Sultan, from Europe.

BRITISH AMBASSADOR LEAVES FOR GERMANY

LONDON, Jan. 16.—Kilmarnock left Monday for Germany to become British diplomatic representative there. This indicates that the British desire to resume full relations with Germany immediately.

KIDNAPING STORY IS SHATTERED AS POLICE START INVESTIGATION

SEATTLE, Wash., Jan. 16.—A kidnapping story was shattered here today when police investigation proved there were no grounds for a report that three men had seized a woman from a downtown sidewalk and escaped with her in a closed automobile. The "kidnaped" young woman, it was found, was a member of a party taking an outing in two machines. When she attempted to leave one machine and enter the other, her friends in the car in which she had been riding grabbed her and pulled her back.

Mrs. G. J. Fuller, wife of a patrolman, saw the incident, and thinking the woman was kidnapped, telephoned the police.

EMPLOYEES MAY BUY U. S. STEEL STOCK

NEW YORK, Jan. 16.—Judge E. H. Gary, president of the United States steel corporation, has decided to offer the company's employees 60,000 shares of common stock at \$1.05. It was announced at Judge Gary's office today.

WILL PROBE ALLEGED UNDERTAKERS LOBBY TO RETURN BODIES

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16.—Charges that an alleged "undertakers' lobby" is behind the movement to have the bodies of American soldiers returned from France will be investigated by the senate military affairs committee. Senator Thomas today called charges made by "Gold Star" mothers that undertakers are behind the movement and asked the committee to investigate.

Representatives of associations in various parts of the country urge the return of American dead from France made personal appeals to the house foreign relations committee for passage of a resolution directing the president to take immediate action along this line.

STEAMERS TO SOUTH CARRY HEAVY CARGOES OF LEFTOVER LIQUOR

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 16.—Freight transportation facilities are being taxed to capacity as a result of an eleventh hour attempt by liquor manufacturers to dispose of stocks of liquor before January 16. With ten thousand barrels of wine and a like number of cases of champagne in its hold, the steamer Stanley Dollar sails tomorrow for Kobe. Practically every ship sailing for south and Central America is heavily laden with California wines and brandy.

ELABORATE MOONSHINE OUTFIT AND LIQUOR SEIZED NEAR BAKER

Sisters at Haines Surprised by Raid Which Uncovers Five Tubs of Corn Syrup Mash and All Accessories.

BAKER, Jan. 16.—One of the most productive raids ever staged in Baker county was accomplished Wednesday evening by Sheriff Anderson when he surprised Mrs. Ernest Hewitt and her sister, Miss Hazel Meyers at their residence at Haines and secured large quantities of moonshine whiskey and an elaborate distilling outfit including the still, burner and all accessories. The evidence seized included five tubs of corn syrup mash, a 24 gallon barrel of molasses, 19 quarts of liquor in fruit jars and a two gallon jar of the product.

The husband of the woman had not been apprehended today. The two prisoners were lodged in the city jail temporarily until a place can be made for them at the county jail. District Attorney W. S. Levens today filed a complaint against them in behalf of the county, and they will also be prosecuted by the government.

STUDENTS' CAMPAIGN NETS \$6,000 FOR FUND

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Jan. 16.—Approximately \$6,000 has already been reported as raised in the students' campaign to raise \$20,000 for the completion of the women's building on the campus. Wilbur Carl of Portland, chairman of the students' committee, expresses the belief that the full reports will show approximately \$10,000 subscribed. The largest contribution made during the vacation drive was \$1000 by a donor who requested that his name be kept secret for the present.

TREATY RENDERS AUSTRIA "PERPETUAL POORHOUSE" WARNS HERBERT HOOVER

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16.—The peace treaty makes Austria a perpetual poorhouse and this condition must be changed in a few years, Herbert Hoover told the house ways and means committee Monday and he urged extension of loans of \$150,000,000 to Austria, Poland and Armenia to prevent starvation, but declared that in giving credits to Austria the U. S. should declare to Europe that European powers are responsible for the situation in Austria. Hoover suggested that union of Austria with Rumania would be one solution of the problem.

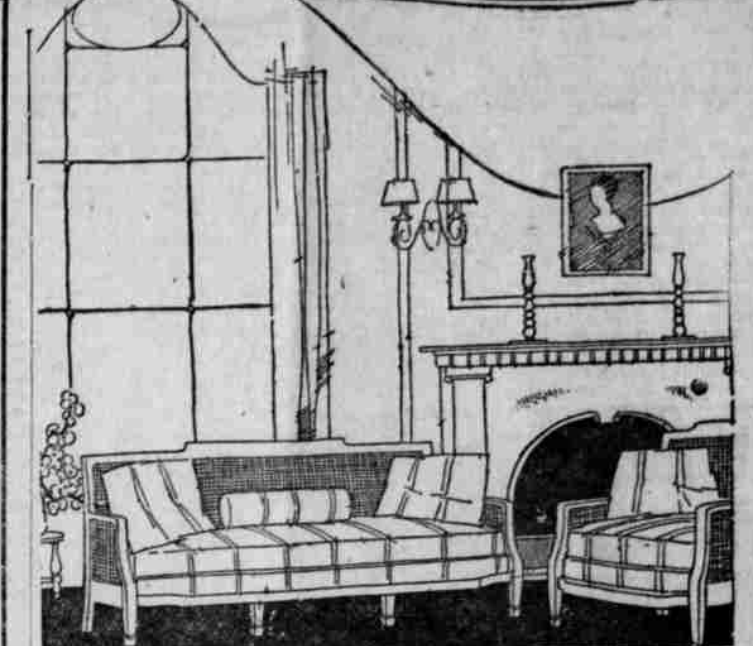
