NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT

Notice is hereby given that at a regular meeting of the Board of Public Works of the City of Pendleton, held on January 15, 1920, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, the City Surveyor of the City of Pendleton did on the 19th day of December, 1919, file in the office of the Recorder of the City of Pendleton, a certain map or plan of proposed street improvements for the following named street in said city:

Jefferson street from the north line of Martin street to the north line of Wilson street, together with the estimated cost thereof with a statement of the estimated cost of such improvements and the percentage of the total cost of improvement, which each of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, situate within the boundaries of the said street, should bear, and

WHEREAS, the council has examined such plans and specifications and estimates and found the same satisfactory to the Board of Public Works, in accordance with the probable cost of such work, and

WHEREAS, the property recommended by the City Surveyor to be included within the boundaries of the district to be improved, is situated within the boundaries of the said street, and the improvement thereon should properly be included therein, and

WHEREAS, the improvement of the hereinabove described portions of Jefferson street, together with the estimated cost thereof, is in the public interest, and the improvement is at this time necessary, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the City of Pendleton, Oregon, do hereby authorize the City Surveyor to proceed to improve the said street, by paving the same with gravel bituminous pavement; such pavement to be constructed with the established grade of the said street, and the cost thereof to be paid by the owners of the lots and parcels of land, situate within the boundaries of the said street, and as shown in the map or plan of proposed street improvements, prepared by F. B. Hayes, City Surveyor, filed with the Recorder of said city on the 19th day of December, 1919, which plans and specifications are hereby particularly referred to; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the engineer's estimate of the probable total cost of such improvement, which said City Surveyor's estimate is in the sum of \$2515.75, and was filed with the Recorder of said city on the 19th day of December, 1919, be and it is hereby included and hereby referred to as "Assessment District No. 71."

RESOLVED, that the plans and specifications and estimates for such improvement as prepared by the City Surveyor and filed with the Recorder of the City of Pendleton on the 19th day of December, 1919, be and they are hereby adopted and approved, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge and lien upon the parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, situate within the boundaries of the said street, shall be liable for the payment of the cost of said work to be charged against each lot, part of lot and parcel of land within the Assessment District No. 71, as shown on the map or plan of proposed street improvements, described in said file in the office of the City Recorder.
