Government Exports Now Total 121,060,000 Bu.
 Exports of wheat and flour July 1, 1919, to January 9, 1920, amount to 82,082,000 bushels of wheat and 8,773,000 barrels of flour, making a total equal to 121,950,000 bushels of wheat compared with 197,672,000

bushels of wheat and 10,617,000 barrels of flour last year to January 9, 1919, the first nine days of January being prorated from the monthly total, making a total equal to 155,450 bushels of wheat.
