NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT

Notice is hereby given that at a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pendleton, held on January 7th, 1926, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, the City Surveyor of the City of Pendleton did on the 7th day of December, 1919, under direction and by requirement of the Common Council, file in the office of the Recorder of the City of Pendleton, plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of the following named street in said city:

Matlock street from the north line of Raleigh street to north line of Jackson street; together with the estimates of the cost thereof with a statement of the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement and the percentage of the total cost of improvement, which each of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land should pay on account of the benefits to be derived from such improvements; and

WHEREAS, the council has examined such plans and specifications and estimates and found the same satisfactory and the estimates therefor to be in accordance with the probable cost of such work; and

WHEREAS, the property recommended by the City Surveyor to be included within the boundaries of the district benefited is in the judgment of the Common Council to be improved within such improvement District and no property is excluded therefrom which should be included therein; and

WHEREAS, the improvement of the hereinabove described portions of Matlock street with Gravel Bitulithic pavement is at this time necessary; therefore be it

RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Pendleton, that it is hereby proposed to improve Matlock street by paving the same with Gravel Bitulithic pavement; such pavement to be constructed and the surface thereof to be finished upon the established grade of said street and the street to have curbs and gutters and all other things in accordance with the plans and specifications as prepared by the City Surveyor, filed with the Recorder of said city on the 7th day of December, 1919, which plans and specifications are hereby particularly referred to; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the engineer's estimates of the probable total cost of such improvement shall be as shown in the engineer's estimates were made and prepared by F. B. Hayes, City Surveyor of said city, on the 7th day of December, 1919, and was filed with the Recorder of said city on the 17th day of December, 1919, and they are hereby adopted and approved; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the cost of making such improvement shall be a charge against and to be paid by the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement, and the owners of such lots, parts of lots and parcels of land shall be liable for the payment of the cost thereof, and be it further

RESOLVED, that an Assessment District is hereby created to be known as Assessment District No. 72, embracing the improvements, which Assessment District shall include all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying and being within the district bounded and described as follows:

Description for Assessment District No. 72

Commencing on the Southwest corner of Lot 6, Block 10, Houser's Addition to Pendleton, thence 20 feet north and parallel with the east line of Matlock street; thence 79 feet (more or less) in a northeasterly direction until the south line intersects with the southwest corner of Lot 6, Block 12, Cole's Addition to Pendleton; thence 158 feet to the north until said line intersects with the northeast corner of Lot 4, Block 13, (more or less) east until said line intersects with the northeast corner of Lot 9, Block 4, Livermore's Addition to Pendleton; thence South 530 feet until said line intersects with the southeast corner of Lot 7, Block 15, Halsey's Addition; thence west 260 feet to the point of beginning.

And be it further

RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution together with the notice that the surveyor's estimate of the proportion of the cost of said work to be charged against each lot, part of lot and parcel of land is hereby designated for a period of ten days in the East Oregonian, which newspaper is hereby designated by the Common Council for the publication thereof.
