WHEREAS, the City Surveyor of the City of Pendleton did on the 15th day of December, 1919, under direction and by authority of the Common Council file in the office of the Recorder of the City of Pendleton, plans and specifications for the improvement of the street of the following named street in said city:

Jefferson street from the north line of Martin street to the north line of Wilson street, together with the estimate and the estimated cost of the improvement of said street, and the estimated cost of the improvement of the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, situated on the north side of said street, and the estimated cost of the improvement of the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, situated on the south side of said street, and the estimated cost of the improvement of the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, situated on the east side of said street, and the estimated cost of the improvement of the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, situated on the west side of said street.
