**Barley and Oats**  
Lower on Exchange.  
Barley and oats are reported lower on the Portland exchange today, with corn about at previous figures. Mill feed lost a half dollar after holding at \$44 and better for several days. Mill feed to day is offered at the mills for \$42.50 a ton and No. 2 barley at \$68. Oats are quoted at \$61, \$61.50 and \$62.50 and corn at \$57 and \$58.75. Hay is selling here in carload quantities at around \$30 with an appreciable increase for smaller quantities.

**Cattle Are Steady and Lambs Higher.**  
Delayed shipments of livestock entered the North Portland alleys and hogs were fully steady; cattle steady while sheep and lambs firm to higher.  
There was quite a liberal supply of hogs, general market top was considered around \$18, but one load held for the extra dime, which was received for a similar supply Monday.
