WHEREAS, the City Surveyor of the City of Pendleton did on the 7th day of December, 1919, under direction and authority of the Common Council, file in the office of the Recorder of the City of Pendleton, plans and specifications for the improvement of the following named street in said city:
Jefferson street from the north line of Martin street to the north line of Wilson street, together with the estimated cost thereof with a statement of the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land to be benefited by such improvement and the percentage of the total cost of improvement, which each of said lots, parts of lots and parcels of land should pay on account of the benefits to be derived from such improvement;
AND WHEREAS, the council has examined such plans and specifications and the estimates therefor to be in accordance with the probable cost of the improvement;
AND WHEREAS, the property recommended by the City Surveyor to be included within the boundaries of the district benefited is in the judgment of the Common Council properly to be included within such improvement district and should properly be included therein;
AND WHEREAS, the improvement of the hereinabove described portions of Jefferson street with Gravel Bitulithic pavement is at this time necessary;
