## MEXICO'S PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION PROMISES FIRST REAL CONTEST IN REPUBLIC'S POLITICS

MEXICO CITY, Jan. 23.—Foreigners have relinquished all concessions they formerly had in the state of lower California. It has been announced by Carranza authorities. This includes rights held by Japanese interests on Magdalena Bay, both on land and water.

Alleging nonperformance of the concession contracts, the Mexican government has assumed possession of nearly 13,000 acres of land in the original grant to California & Mexico Land & Cattle Company and of other tracts of from one to three million acres each.

## Election Looks Lively

This year's presidential election promises to be the first real contest the republic of Mexico ever had. In former years, Diaz, Madero and Carranza were practically unopposed in their races. This year it is expected the outcome will be a matter of doubt until the count of votes has been made and the result announced.

General Alvaro Obregon, General Ubaldo Gonzalez and Ambassador Ygnacio Bonillas are the three leading candidates. The first two are generally credited with most chances of winning. Bonillas having been in Washington as Mexico's representative in the United States and therefore unable to get in touch with the voters.

Of the two military leaders, each is acknowledged as having enough of a following to raise the banner of revolution should either decide to fight for the election after the votes are counted. Bonillas is not likely to contest the election as he has little following among those outside the government.

The average well-informed Mexican here believes the election of July will be a final showdown as to whether Mexico is stable or not. If the candidates refuse to abide by the decision of the ballot box, there are not a few who believe the United States will step in, in case of another revolution.

There is no ground for the belief Carranza is plotting to retain his office in spite of the outcome of the elections. This rumor has been denied by premier Aguirre Berlanga, probably closest to Carranza of any of his advisers.

## Carranza Conservative

President Carranza's firm hold on the Mexican people has been caused by his conservative position with regard to the Agrarian question, according to general belief here.

Porfirio Diaz took one extreme—that the peons should have no land—and Madero took another—that the peons should have it all. Both Madero and Diaz fell. But Carranza's proposed division of land is steadily

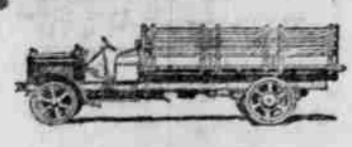
