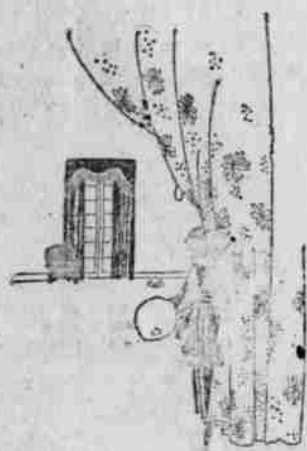

## KRUPPS WORKERS LIKE BIG, CONTENTED FAMILY

ESSEN, Germany, Jan. 26.—The Krupp works, which formed the backbone of Germany's munitions supply, are employing today about the same number of men as before the war. This does not represent, however, the same amount of business in the plant as in the pre-war period, says officials of the works, inasmuch as the labor situation is altered and extra workers are needed because of the eight-hour day.

The employment roll before the war stood—in July, 1914, the Essen works proper employed 41,263 and the outside Krupp works, 40,118; in June, 1918, Essen employed 112,260 and the outside works, 68,641; while today the roll stands, Essen 44,758 and outer works, 49,118.

Formerly, the Krupp works had a twelve hour day with two hours out for meals and rest. The laborer went to work at 8 a. m. and quit at 6 p. m. Now in some parts it is necessary to have three shifts to keep fires going.

The "piece work" system is in force. This system, gradually coming into effect in Germany again, appears to work well in the Krupp plant.

And the spirit among the workmen is altogether better than in many of the rest of Germany's industrial works. A generous percentage live in company houses, which would make a middleclass American envious and would look like a palace compared to some corporation houses in the states.

Then there is a pension system, a savings system, a general paternalism about the place. In fact, the Krupp works idea has always been that of a sort of big family. It is the largest company in the world, it believe which is controlled and practically entirely owned by a single family. And Essen, a clean, smiling comfortable appearing city of 200,000 is made up mainly of people whose business is to be in the fact that the Krupp works are in existence.

Herr Krupp von Bohlen and his wife have made it a point to retain their old workers. Men who had jobs before the war are on their payroll, and those who have lost out were either the women workers taken on temporarily on the conscripted laborers and foreigners engaged for the war's duration.

Many of the workers are men who have grown gray in the service.

They have the family solidarity idea, and this family solidarity idea has displaced the communists and radical socialists, for it has so far frustrated their efforts to cause an upset in the industrial fabric of the Krupp institution. True, there were a few disturbances for a day or two during the revolution. But that is past, and for the most part, the workmen goes on reasonably contentedly with his work.

Virtually no women are now employed. About 25 per cent of the wartime increase was of women employees. Now only a few are retained—generally widows of former employees, who are given work largely out of sympathy.

## INTERNATIONAL TRADE COMMISSION IS URGED

WASHINGTON, Jan. 26.—(United Press.)—Curbing of monopolies by an International Trade Commission, was urged today by Huston Thompson, federal trade commissioner, speaking at the Pan-American Financial Conference here.

Pointing out the success of the Federal Trade Commission in halting activities of "trusts" in price boosting and unfair trade methods, Thompson said there is need of an international body to prevent a trust in one country from unfair dealings in another country.

"As the world began to fight its way out of the miasma produced by war, it discovered that monopoly was occupying the seats of the mighty and trying to justify its right to them," said Thompson. "Reports from legislative halls and the declarations in trade journals of the nations demonstrate this."

Great Britain, Denmark, Canada and Argentina, he said, are preparing to battle monopolies, by cutting trade commissions.

"The spirit of fair play in trade must be reciprocal. American competitors may police each other in your countries," Thompson said, in explaining the benefits to be secured from such an international body. "Our Federal Trade Commission will be in duty bound to inspire their actions. After each nation has its own trade commission to follow its competing exporters there is a final step to be taken."

Thompson suggested the establishment of commissions in each country along the lines of the Federal Trade Commission in this country, and the merging of all of them into an international body.
