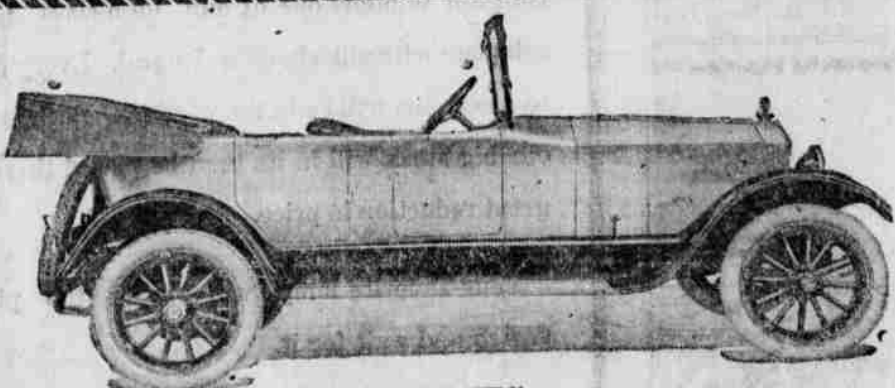

INSURRECTION HALTS LODGE COMPROMISING

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24.—The bi-partisan treaty conference was again called off today by Senator Lodge who notified democratic senators he wished to consult his republican colleagues.

Cancellation of the conference was the first direct result of yesterday's insurrection in republican ranks which resulted in a warning to Lodge that any compromise on the treaty would endanger party solidarity and his leadership. Lodge and republicans conferees today went into secret session to discuss their course.

Lodge later announced he will spend today and tomorrow conferring with republicans and will call the bi-partisan conference together Monday. He pointed to what he called the "hopeless weakness" of the position taken by irreconcilables.

NEW ORDER SIMPLIFIES NATURALIZATION RULE

PORTLAND, Jan. 26.—New regulations governing naturalization proceedings were adopted Saturday by the seven Multnomah county circuit judges. The new set of rules will materially reduce the time necessary to devote to each candidate, and it is probable that the judges will be enabled to formally admit an alien to citizenship in five minutes, compared to the 20 or 40 minutes previously required.

This will not mean, however, that those seeking to become citizens will be able to escape any of the former requirements. Each candidate must present himself to the naturalization examiner at room 211, new postoffice building, to submit to a thorough examination as to his qualifications for citizenship. This was formerly conducted in court and consumed a vast amount of time.

With his certificate of fitness, he must then file his final petition for naturalization at the county clerk's office. At those who have previously filed their petitions must also submit themselves for examination.

PROFITEERS "SANDBAG" PUBLIC SAYS CLAPPER

WASHINGTON, Jan. 26.—Profiteers are "sandbagging the public," Senator Clapper declared in a speech today. Profiteering is becoming the last straw in the strained economic situation, he said.

Clapper scored the department of justice for not being more aggressive in prosecuting profiteers. He advocated jailing them. He scored the large earnings of big concerns declaring the wrath of the people is being stirred by this plundering. Clapper said: "The net profits of the American Woolen Company after federal taxes were deducted were \$2,779,600 in 1914 and \$12,224,084 in 1915. Earnings on its common stock this year, according to the last Wall Street information, exceed \$100 a share, or more than the stock's par value. For wool that goes into a suit of clothes which sells for \$100 the wool growers receive \$7.37."

VIENNA ART MUSEUM ROBBED OF GEMS AND CURIOS OF VAST VALUE

VIENNA, Jan. 26.—The art museum was robbed today of gems and curios valued at 20,000 Kronen.

WINSTON CHURCHILL IS MENTIONED BY LONDON PRESS WITH WAR GUILTY

LONDON, Jan. 26.—Britain's "war mongers and war contract profiteers" should be tried for their crimes the same as the former kaiser, the Daily Herald stated, adding that Winston Churchill, secretary of state for the war, also should be tried for his attempts to instigate war with Russia.

KAISER MAY BE TRIED IN ABSENCE, PERHAPS DECLARED LUNATIC

MANCHESTER, England, Jan. 26.—The Manchester Guardian today hints that a solution of the difficulty with regard to the trial of the former German Emperor will be found.

"The ex-kaiser will be summoned to trial before the allied commission and if he does not answer—it is possible he may not—he will be tried in his absence, the newspapers say. 'By this course his full guilt will be made manifest to the world by the testimony of witnesses, including Germans, his correspondence and other documents. Sentence will be pronounced and if it cannot be executed it will, at any rate, be on record. One possibility is that on evidence available from Germany and Holland the ex-kaiser will be proved a criminal lunatic.'"

BANDIT IS KILLED IN FUTILE BANK ROBBERY

ST. LOUIS, Jan. 26.—One bandit was killed and Patrolman Shea was seriously injured in a revolver battle after six highwaymen held up the Water Tower bank here today. The bandits were equipped with a grip filled with currency from the bank when Shea opened fire. They dropped the grip and fled after Shea had killed one of their number.

FOREIGN EXCHANGE HIT BY UTTER COLLAPSE

NEW YORK, Jan. 26.—Utter collapse and demoralization overtook the foreign exchange market today, resulting in new low records for British, French, Italian and various other European currencies.

The rate for British demand bills fell to \$3.66 3/4, or 3 1/2c under its previous minimum, and Paris checks, Italian lire and Belgian francs fell in corresponding or greater degree. Dealers in ordering were again inclined to attribute today's collapse to such well-known and long-existing conditions as the unfavorable trade balances against almost all the foreign centers and failure of the United States senate to ratify the peace treaty. France, with a normal or pre-war value of about 19 cents, fell to the

point where it took almost 12 to purchase an American dollar, while lire on Italian exchange, ordinarily on a parity with French quotations, dropped to a level where almost 14 were required to equal the American dollar. No important form of exchange, not even rubles, which are only nominally quoted at 1/2 to 1/3 cent, against the pre-war quotation of 1/2 cent, has suffered as much as the German mark. Quoted before the war at 2 1/2 cents, the mark today dwindled to slightly under 1/2 cent.

COMING OFFICERS OF MERCHANT MARINE ARE GIVEN QUIZ

SEATTLE, Jan. 26.—(By United Press)—Officials of the Washington State Nautical school are today marking the papers of applicants who took the examinations for entrance to the school.

This school, which is conducted by the state of Washington, with the cooperation of the federal government, is "for the instruction and training of youths, bona fide residents of the state of Washington, in the science and practice of navigation," seamanship, marine engineering and all matters pertaining to the proper construction, equipment and sailing of vessels, in order to prepare students to become officers of the American merchant marine.

The students are in training, aboard the school-ship Vicksburg, for two years. During seven months of each year, the ship will be moored in Lake Washington here, and will cruise for the other five months of the year. The state bears all the expenses of the cadets with the exception of clothing, for which a deposit of \$115 is required.
