NEWS OF THE COUNTY OFFICES AND OFFICERS

Bankruptcy Hearing Postponed.
 The meeting of the creditors of A. E. Yoder, bankrupt, set for today, was postponed today for an indefinite time, owing to Mr. Yoder's illness with influenza. He resides at Rieth.

Supplemental Appraisal Filed.
 The supplemental appraisal in the estate of the late Claus H. Rosenberg was filed with the county clerk today. It represents the deceased's interest in growing crops at the time of his death and is fixed at \$784. John E. Montgomery, Alfred Schneider and George A. Hartman were the appraisers.

Suit to Clear Title.
 V. A. Bott today brought suit in circuit court against Lewis E. Neil et al. to clear title to lots 1, 2 and 3, block 13, Raley's addition to Pendleton. He is represented by Peterson, Bishop & Clark.

Case to Be Tried in Portland.
 H. B. Lindley, who received \$200 by telegraphic order from Portland to the First National Bank here, using the name of Seth Schaeffer, was returned to Portland for prosecution today after having been arrested there last week and sent to the county jail here. Deputy Sheriff Mollenhour took the man to the metropolis on No. 1. The case against Lindley is being prosecuted by the Western Union Telegraph Co., it having developed that the company delivered the money on stolen identification presented by Lindley. Inasmuch as neither the bank nor Mr. Schaeffer stands the loss, the case was not one for the Umatilla county courts to prosecute.

AMERICAN CONSULS PICK ONLY SUPERIOR FOR NEW CITIZENS

NAPLES, Jan. 28.—Italians who have been to Russia and those who have been to the United States on any charge whatever are unable to get past the American consuls in Italian cities, who are exercising the strictest surveillance of passport files to prevent bolsheviks and anarchists from returning to the United States on the wave of immigration which is moving toward America as rapidly as ships can carry the emigrants.

The number demanding visas exceeds the transportation capacity so greatly that the American officials are turning down all doubtful cases, passing only those thoroughly literate and of good character. Certificates are required from courts that the applicant for a visa has never been arrested and also a certificate that no charge is pending against him. In the case of a soldier, his discharge papers must show his record.

The consuls take ample time to investigate all questionable cases. The passport fee are producing a tremendous income at the seaport consulates. The Naples consulate will probably clear \$100,000 above expenses this year.

PEACE FIRST, THEN LEAGUE IS BALLOT OF STUDENTS

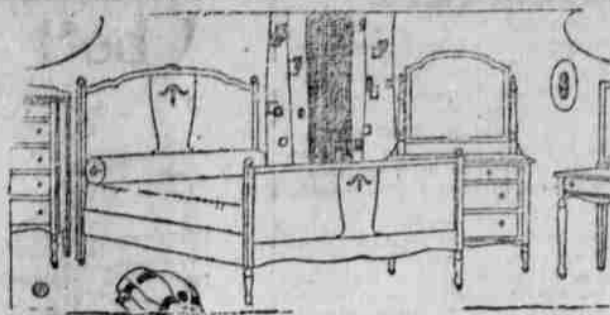

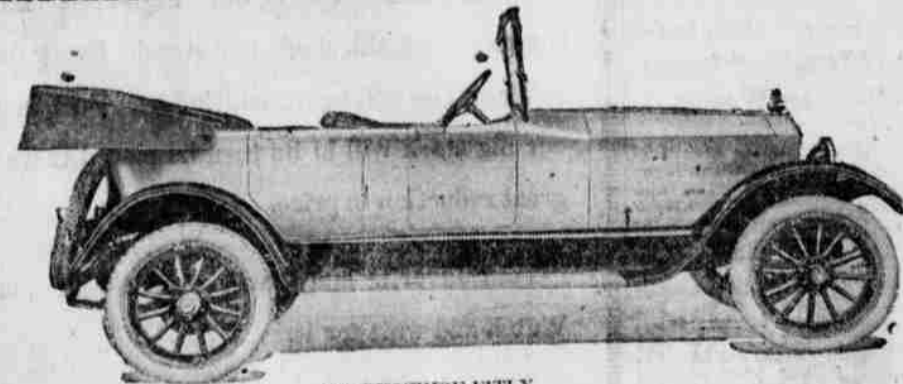

Of the faculty, a plurality of those voting cast their votes for unreserved ratification, with 24 for this proposition to 16 for a proposition favoring any reasonable compromise which would bring immediate ratification and an equal number for the "mild" reservations favored by the McNary group of senators.

BODY OF ASTORIA MAN IS FOUND IN STREAM

ASTORIA, Jan. 28.—The body of Lars Lahl, commonly known as Jacobs Bay, has been found in the Columbia river near Smith's point. The man lived alone in a cabin at the Union Fishermen's Co-operative Packing company's tracks and had been missing since Sunday. He is believed to have fallen overboard while at work. He was a native of Finland, 74 years of age and had resided here about a quarter of a century. He left five sons and two daughters.

EMANELING OF JURY FOR I. W. W. IS SLOW

WASHINGTON, Jan. 28.—No progress with the selection of jurors to try the I. W. W. accused of the Centralia murders was made at the morning session of the court. A special venire of 300 was called when the court opened. The session was devoted to explanations to court of reasons for being exempted from jury duty. Sickness, advanced age and other excuses were accepted by the court.

PHILIPPINE OFFICIAL HURT IN ACCIDENT

MANILA, P. I., Jan. 28.—Vice Governor General Carlos E. Lester of the Philippines was slightly injured and a friend named Bothwell of St. Louis was painfully injured when an axle on the automobile in which they were riding broke, swerving the machine against a tree. Bothwell was removed to a military hospital but the extent of his injuries has not yet been determined.

PALMER CHARGED WITH "PLAIN CASE OF COLD FEET" ON SEDITION BILL

WASHINGTON, Jan. 28.—"A plain case of cold feet" is the way Representative Rodenberg characterized the apparently changed views of Attorney General Palmer on sedition, when the house rules committee resumed hearings on the Graham bill today. Rodenberg criticized Palmer for his failure to appear before the committee in support of the proposed sedition legislation.
