OREGON AGRICULTURE COLLEGE, Corvallis, Jan. 29.—College enrollment has soared more than 1000 per cent since the school year 1900-1901, according to figures compiled by H. M. Tennant, registrar. Attendance in other words, has increased from 426 to 4711. This includes both short and long course students. With this rapid influx has come the necessity for a larger instructional staff and on top of this costs of supplies have advanced materially. Class room and laboratory facilities are said to be entirely inadequate.
