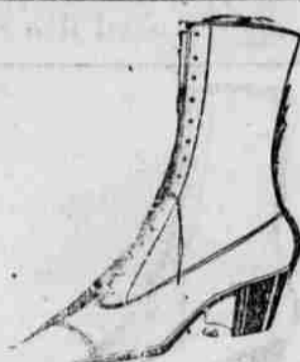

## ELECTRIC LINES WILL ASK STILL HIGHER FARES DURING 1920

In Poll of 53 Cities, Only 12 Are Charged Same Rates and in 11 of These Steps are Being Taken for Advance.

NEW YORK, Jan. 20.—Nineteen and twenty is destined to witness renewed efforts on the part of officials of electric railway systems throughout the United States to obtain authority to charge still higher fares than were granted the public service corporations in 1919 and 1918.

In a poll of 53 cities taken by the United Press, reports showed that in only twelve cities fares have not been raised, while in the other 41 incorporation of from a fraction of a cent to 4 or 5 cents have been granted.

In eleven of the twelve cities where the cost of a car ride remains the same, however, either definite steps have already been taken looking toward a revision of the fare in favor of the operating companies, or advertising campaigns are being put on to prepare the public mind for a later demand. In only one city has there been an actual downward revision of the fare.

### Costs Soaring.

Increased cost of labor, steel, copper, wire and the hundred and one other kinds of materials necessary to the operation of an electric line has been the one outstanding reason advanced by the corporations in asking for more money. The aid nickel that used to be enough to pay all expenses and then produce a respectable profit now pays only about 2 1/2 for 3 cents toward the upkeep and operation of the roads, officials argue.

In several cities, notably New York, municipal lines have been put in operation, substituting for various car routes. New York's riding public has several months been bombarded with propaganda for an advance in fare on surface, elevated and subway lines. The fare has remained at 5 cents, however, although two or three companies suspended transfer privileges and ceased to operate cars on a few lines.

### Increases Withdrawn.

In Chicago the state public utilities commission granted the surface and elevated lines authority to raise their fares from 5 cents to seven and eight cents respectively. Recently, however, when examination showed the companies prospered too greatly on the advanced rates, the increases were withdrawn and now the cars may be ridden in the lake metropolis for six cents.

Fares in cities which have not seen higher transportation are: Dallas, Tex., 25 rides for a dollar; Des Moines Iowa, 5 cents; St. Paul, Minn., 5 cents; San Francisco, Cal., 5 cents; Los Angeles, Cal., 5 cents; Columbus, O., eight rides for 25 cents; Cleveland, O., six tickets for 25 cents with 1 cent extra for transfers; Buffalo, N. Y., 5 cents; New York, 5 cents; Philadelphia, Pa., 5 cents with 2-cent exchange tickets and free transfers; Nashville, Tenn., 5 cents; and Rochester, N. Y., 5 cents.

## TEEL DISTRICT SEEKS INTEREST GUARANTEE

SALEM, Jan. 20.—Application of the Teel Irrigation district for state guarantee of the interest payments on a \$929,000 bond issue were taken under advisement by the state irrigation securities commission after arguments in favor of the guarantee had been presented by J. F. Spinning of Echo, secretary; J. T. Hinkle, Hermiston, attorney, and Claude McCullough of Portland, attorney for the district. A decision on the application is expected within two weeks.

## ALL COUNTRY ENJOYS GREAT WEALTH GAIN

WASHINGTON, Jan. 20.—Decentralization of the country's banking resources and widespread distribution of wealth, indicated by an increase in resources of 1000 per cent or more in 16 states since 1899, was shown by a comparison of present bank resources with conditions 20 years ago, issued today by John Skelton Williams, controller of the currency. Every section of the country has shared in the tremendous increase in wealth since 1899, but the report shows that the Pacific coast has experienced the largest percentage of increase in national bank resources,
