## NEWS OF THE COUNTY OFFICES AND OFFICERS

**Three Foreclosure Applications In.**  
 Three more applications for the foreclosure of delinquent tax liens were filed today with County Clerk Brown, bringing the total for the month to nine. Asa B. Thomson seeks to foreclose against Andrew M. Mann, while Umatilla county seeks to foreclose against Walter Hothchild, et al, and against J. A. Keller, et al. Raley, Raley & Steiner are attorneys for the applicant in the first case and District Attorney R. I. Keator for the county in the other two.

**Roller Mills Brings Suit.**  
 J. A. and W. P. Gugin are defendants in a suit filed today by the Pendleton Roller Mills to collect \$482.50 and interest upon a promissory note signed by the two. C. D. Zehring is made defendant in a separate suit to collect \$225.40 and \$217.75, alleged due on two promissory notes given the mill. Attorney fees of \$50 are asked in the first action and \$12 and \$25 respectively in the second. Raley, Raley & Steiner and H. J. Warner represent the plaintiff.

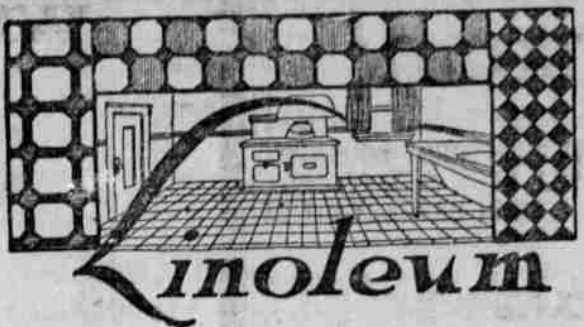

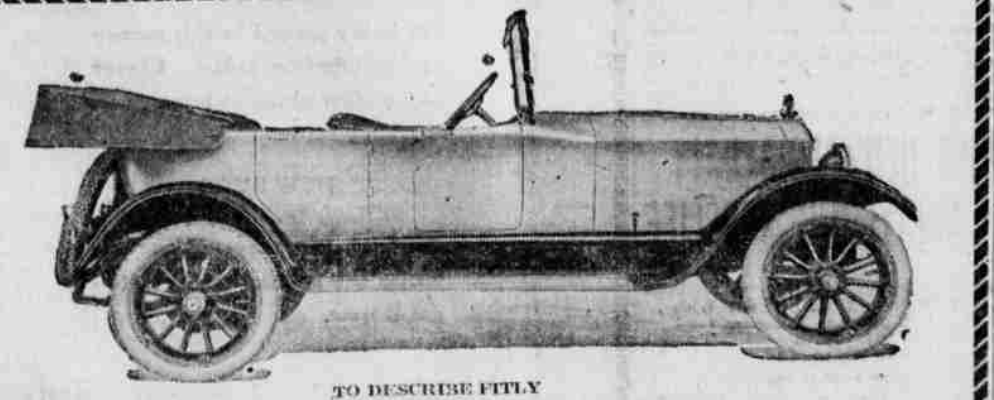

## WHITMAN CONSERVATORY ADDS NEW DEPARTMENT

WALLA WALLA, Jan. 29.—Whitman Conservatory of Music, through its director, Howard E. Pratt, announces the addition of a new department which should be of interest to all players of hand instruments. Arrangements have been made with Arthur A. McKenzie, one of the best-known hand masters in navy circles, who will offer a thorough course on all wind instruments, particular attention being given to saxophone, wood winds, and double B bass.  
 Mr. McKenzie has served sixteen years in Uncle Sam's navy as bandmaster, the first half of this time being spent at sea, having supervision of bands on some of the nation's largest battleships. The past six years he has been permanently stationed at Bremerton navy yards and the fame of the Jackie band there, under his direction has spread through all the northwest.  
 Mr. McKenzie is now enjoying an extended furlough and the conservatory feels it has not only cause to congratulate itself on having secured to its faculty another noted musician, but that it can further meet the musical needs of Walla Walla and its environs.

## IDAHO'S CONSTABULARY IS STUDIED IN WEST

 BOISE, Idaho, Jan. 29.—Administrative officers of many western States are studying Idaho's constabulary, and legislatures may be expected to vote on acts similar to the one operative here, according to Robert G. Jones, state commissioner of law enforcement.  
 Jones said he had received many inquiries from Pacific coast states as to the effectiveness of the constabulary in stamping out racketeering and enforcing prohibition laws.  
 The act creating the constabulary placed Idaho on a war footing and set up virtually a commander-in-chief of all police officers whose powers include the drafting of every citizen if necessary.

**Act Is Comprehensive.**  
 Summarized, the act contains the following:  
 Creates the department of law enforcement, composed of all officers of the state, counties and municipalities, who possess the power of peace officers. Jones is the department head. The department has power:  
 (1) To take all steps necessary to enforce all the state's criminal laws.  
 (2) To assist in detecting crime; to procure evidence; to make arrests; to suppress riots, and to enforce law and order throughout the state.  
 (3) To enforce the laws for prevention of wrongs to children and dumb animals.  
 (4) To supervise the members of the constabulary in the discharge of their official duties.  
 (5) To enforce laws for protection or control and maintenance of delinquent, dependent or neglected children.  
 (6) To enforce all the state's laws for temperance and morality.  
 (7) To employ from time to time such state policemen as need to carry out the duties of the department. Any officer or employee of the state may be deputized as a state policeman.  
 (8) To call into the police service of the state any of the members of the state constabulary (peace officers of any city or county) at any time it may be deemed necessary to preserve order and enforce law in any part of the state.  
 (9) To assemble the constabulary for the purpose of perfecting or maintaining proper organization, etc.  
 (10) To order the abatement of public nuisances and to enforce such order by appropriate court procedure.  
 May Call Any Member  
 Individual members of the constabulary and peace officers, when called into the state's service have jurisdiction in any part of the state. They may call to their assistance any member of the state constabulary or any other person.  
 Any person wilfully failing or refusing to obey the call for assistance to the department or a person acting under its jurisdiction, or failing to perform any duty imposed upon him shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall forfeit his office.  
 The act appropriated \$50,000 for the use of the constabulary. Since the constabulary has only four agents constantly in its employ, stationed in various parts of the state, it has not been costly.

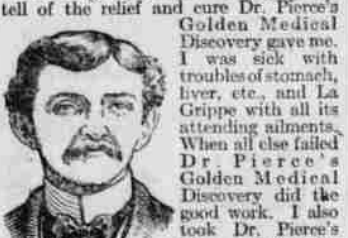
