INVESTIGATORS, INCOGNITO, WILL LOOK INTO PRICES IN 31 LARGEST CITIES

WASHINGTON, Jan. 29.—An extensive survey of the cost of living situation will be started next week by the department of labor to obtain information for use in adjusting wage rates. Inquiry will be made into the costs of clothing, rent and other necessities.

Investigators will probe conditions in the 31 largest cities of the country, including San Francisco, Portland and Seattle.

Food prices will not be investigated at this time. The probe is expected to last six weeks.

Investigators, posing as ordinary ultimate consumers, will rent houses and trade with local merchants in their neighborhoods, keeping a record of prices. Their identity will be kept secret until the investigation has been completed. Landlords and grocers will not know they are dealing with government agents.

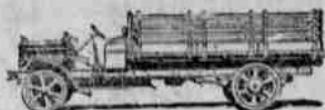

While in France he became a sergeant in the Headquarters Troop of the Eighty-ninth Division and was nicknamed in the thick of several big engagements on the Alsace sector. His health became affected and he announced his retirement from the war, but months of roughing it in the mountains of Wyoming convinced him that he was himself again. In the mountains Joe Stecher had defeated all the other heavyweight wrestlers and claimed Caddock's title.
