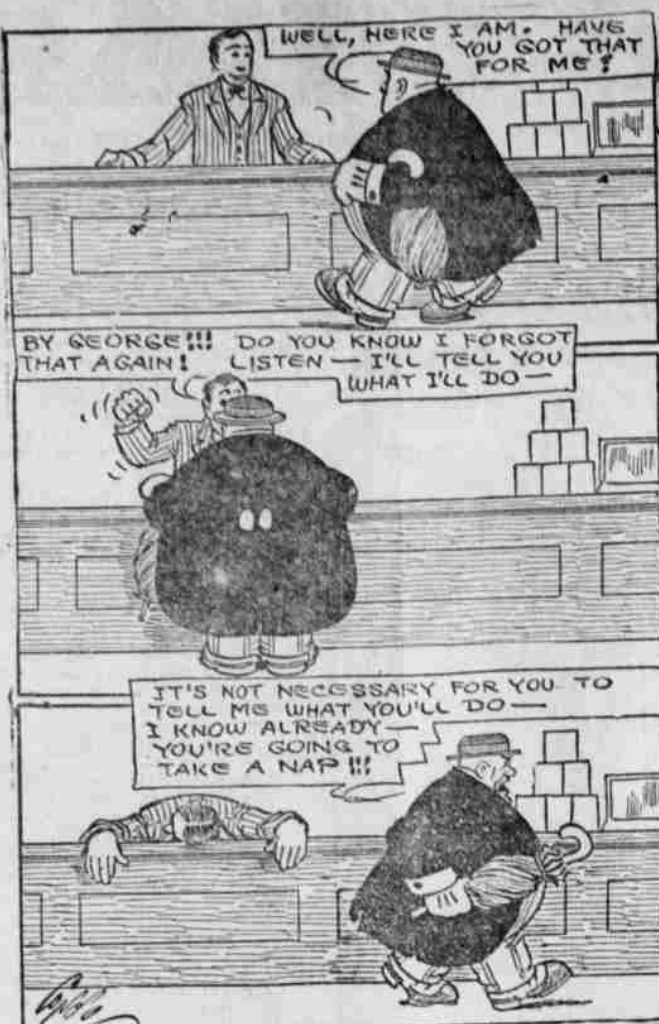

There was a small supply of hogs reported in. Only Willamette valley offerings came forward, and as these could not be shipped to other centers without the payment of additional freight, top prices were not realized, although quality was present.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Jan. 29.—With the allegation that her husband, Frank Mayo, actor and at present a director for the Universal Film company, has been spending large sums of money on other women, especially Miss Godowsky, Godowsky, Mrs. Joyce Eleanor Mayo filed suit for separate maintenance in the superior court here.

"Ridiculous," declared Madame Godowsky, mother of Miss Godowsky, who is the youngest daughter of Leopold Godowsky, famous pianist.
