NEWS OF THE COUNTY OFFICES AND OFFICERS

Local Couple Issued License.

A marriage license was issued by the county clerk today to William P. Mayers and Mrs. Cella Caldwell, both of Pendleton.

Wants Title to Lots.

Suit to clear title to two lots in Umatilla was filed today by P. W. Cline against John Freeman et al. The plaintiff is represented in the action by Halsey, Raley & Steiwer and H. J. Warner.

Sues to Collect on Note.

The First National Bank of Pendleton today filed suit against Gerald Kilgore and the Farmers Union Grain Agency to collect \$900, alleged due on a promissory note signed by Kilgore. The note was made originally to the grain agency and endorsed by one of its representatives to the bank. The bank alleges that the agency also guaranteed payment of the note. Interest from January 20, 1919, is also sought, together with \$100 attorney fees. Carter & Smythe represent the plaintiffs.

Jury Will Not Meet Monday.

Owing to the fear of influenza, Judge G. W. Phelps has postponed the convening of the circuit court jury on Monday. The time for jury cases has been left indefinite. Several cases involving the Farmers Union Grain Agency were to have come up for trial Monday.

School Money Available.

The county treasurer has \$25,928.46 in funds belonging to the bonded school districts of the county which is now available for loan to responsible parties. Persons wishing to borrow a part or all of this sum may make application to the treasurer, at the same time stating the nature of the security they can give. Property of about three times the value of the loan is required. The county school superintendent, the judge and the treasurer comprise a board which determines conditions of the loans. No loans are made for less than a year. In two months there will be \$20,000 more available.

Judgment on Mandate Entered.

A judgment on the mandate of the state supreme court was entered with the county clerk today in the case of Marian Caldwell vs. J. T. Hoskins et al, which case was settled by a verdict for the plaintiff two weeks ago at Salem. Mrs. Caldwell is given a judgment of \$1500 with interest at 6 per cent.

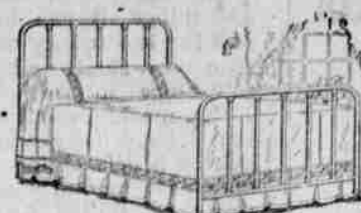

SINN FEIN SCHEME TO SWAY NEW PARLIAMENT

(United Press Staff Correspondent.) DUBLIN, Feb. 5.—"Without shedding a drop of blood, we can smash Lloyd George's little home rule scheme and make a laughing stock of the government."

Thus one of the Sinn Fein leaders answered questions as to what the Sinn Feiners intend to do in case the government goes ahead with the enforcement of the new home rule plan. Although firmly convinced that the government will never attempt to enforce the scheme, the Sinn Feiners are quietly mapping out a course of action to upset the government's plans. As tentatively decided upon the Sinn Feiners have evolved an ingenious scheme to twist the government's home rule plan into a "weapon of offense."

The course of action now under discussion is as follows: The Sinn Feiners would order their followers to participate in good faith in the elections for the parliament which is to be created for the south of Ireland under the premier's bill. And it is practically certain that the Sinn Feiners would sweep the elections in the South and dominate the Parliament.

Then at the first session of the parliament and as the first act of the parliament, the Sinn Feiners would give the home rule scheme a dramatic "coup de grace" by declaring Ireland a republic and proclaiming its severance from England. The leaders are certain that such a "Declaration of Independence" would be passed by an overwhelming majority in the parliament.

Thereafter the Parliament would be continued as the "Dail Eireann" or Assembly of the Irish Republic, inasmuch as the original "Dail Eireann" has been suppressed into the unrec-

anted position of having themselves re-created the "Dail."

So the Sinn Feiners are chuckling in their sleeves and waiting for the government's next move. "The Lloyd George scheme is not home rule and we won't have it," said the Sinn Fein leader. "By our scheme we will accomplish several things besides getting rid of the home rule bill. We will make the British government a laughing stock before the world, and let it prove to the world by its own actions that Ireland—or at least the majority of it—demands self-determination and independence. What mination and independence. What could do that better than to have the first parliament set up by the government itself declare for independence as its first official act. And that's what it will do if they attempt to enforce this so-called home rule bill."
