EXTREMISTS LAUNCH CHAIN LETTER SCHEME TO TORTURE POLICE

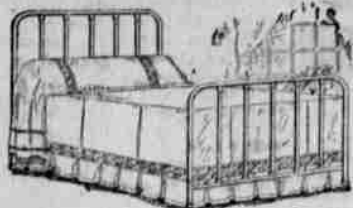
Sinn Fein, in Effort to Drive British Rule Out of Ireland, Hound Constabulary With "Doom" Propaganda.

DUBLIN, Feb. 6.—In their effort to drive the British government out of Ireland, the extreme section of Sinn Fein is waging a species of guerrilla warfare upon the Royal Irish Constabulary.

The more radical elements of Sinn Fein has instituted a remarkable campaign of terrorism and intimidation against the police force urging systematic extermination by shooting from ambush and attacks in force upon police barracks. In the past few months scores of such attacks have been made in widely separate parts of Ireland, resulting in the killing of fifteen policemen and wounding of many more.

Government of Police

The extremists advance the arguments that the power of the British government depends upon the police force—that the government would be helpless and unable to enforce their laws if deprived of the support of the police. Therefore they intend to make the life of police unsafe and unbearable in the hope that the power of the government will be weakened.

In carrying out this campaign the leaders have started an unparalleled "chain letter" directed against the Royal Irish Constabulary as a whole. Every argument to stir up bitterness and hatred is utilized. In some sections of the South of Ireland the leaders have ordered their followers not to associate with or speak to policemen and to report the names of any person seen associating with a member of the constabulary.

Send Chain Letter
One of the newest devices to arouse hatred is a "chain letter" scheme. The following document has been sent out to a number of Sinn Feiners with instructions to copy it four times and send it to four friends, who are to repeat the operation indefinitely.

"They have sent for silver the flesh and blood of their people.
"For money their hands are dipped in the blood of their people.
"What of the people? Shall they grasp the hand of Cain?
"They are the eyes and ears of the enemy."

"Let these eyes and ears know no friendship.
"See that there are none who shall associate with them. See you that those who do are treated likewise.
"The blood of our martyrs shall be on them and their children's children, and they shall curse the mothers that bring them forth."

"And the Lord set mark upon Cain." So widespread is the fear inspired that in the hotbeds of Sinn Feiners in the South, the police are avoided like the plague. Even the former friends of the police, who are nearly all Irish, are afraid to be seen talking to them.

The government has been forced to close many outlying police stations and concentrate the forces for safety, and increase the patrols to three or four in a group.

All "In Pay" Doomed
In County Cork certain Sinn Fein leaders sent out formal orders declaring that every policeman and person in the "army of England" are "doomed to have forfeited their life," and calling upon their followers to execute the orders.

A copy of this remarkable document is in the hands of the government authorities. It reads as follows:

"We hereby proclaim a military area with the following regulations:
"(a) A policeman found within said area on or after this date will be deemed to have forfeited his life, the more notorious police being dealt with as far as possible first.

"(b) Every person in the pay of England (magistrates, jurors, etc.) who helps England to rule this country or who assists in any way the upholders of the foreign government will be deemed to have forfeited his life.
"(c) Civilians who give information to the police or soldiers specially such information as is of a serious character, if convicted, will be executed, i. e., shot or hanged.

"(d) Police, doctors and prison officials who assist at, or who countenance, or who are responsible for, in any way connected with obtaining information from any Irish citizen for use against any other may be executed at sight as a common outlaw. Offending persons will be executed should it take years to track them down.

"(e) Every citizen must assist, when required, in enabling us to perform our duty."

As a result of this campaign of terrorism recruiting for the constabulary has come to a standstill, and it is rumored that the government is considering drafting several hundred policemen from London.
