

SINGLE LEGISLATIVE HOUSE IS PROPOSED FOR STATE CONTROL

Body of 100 Members Sitting
in Continuous Session, Each
Receiving \$5000, Urged in
Oregon as Efficiency Aid.

SALEM, Feb. 6.—A single legislative body of 100 members to sit in continuous session, performing the executive as well as the legislative functions of the state government and drawing salaries of \$5000 each, was suggested by Professor M. A. Margruder of the Oregon Agricultural college in an address at the public library here Wednesday night.

INCOME TAX RETURNS MUST ITEMIZE EVERY BIT OF COMPENSATION

Earners Must Not Confine
Statement to Telling Year's
Pay at Certain Rate But Re-
port Actual Figure.

Income tax returns, now being made in compliance with the law must itemize every form of compensation received in 1919, according to statements sent to W. D. Chamberlain, deputy internal revenue collector who has offices in Pendleton. His statement, issued by Milton A. Miller, collector of internal revenue, says:

"Guess work, estimates and other hit-or-miss tactics are barred when a person is making out his income tax return. Accuracy and completeness must be insisted upon. The return is a sworn statement; as such, it must be thorough and accurate."

Must Show Actual Amount.

"Salaried persons and wage earners must not confine their returns to figures showing a year's pay at so much a day or so much a week. The actual amount drawn should be ascertained and reported. Overtime, bonuses, shares in the profits of a business, values of quarters and board furnished by the employer and a number of other items of similar nature which are compensations for services are taxable as part of the year's earnings and must be included."

"It must be borne in mind that compensation may be paid in other than in cash. A bonus paid in Liberty bonds is taxable at the market value of the bonds. A note received in payment for services is taxable income at its face value, and the interest upon it is also taxable."

"Premiums paid by an employer for life or other insurance in favor of employees is additional compensation to the employee."

"The income tax does not apply to amounts received under accident and health insurance, or under workmen's compensation laws; and damages recovered by suit or settlement for injuries or sickness is also exempt."

Tips are Included

"Tips received by waiters, porters and others are taxable income for such persons as are in recognition of services and are not gifts."

"A person paid by an employer or by the United States government for taxable income. A widow who received payments in recognition of the services of her late husband, may construe such payments as gifts."

"Aside from what a person may earn by his services, there are many other sources of income. He must include in his annual reckoning the gains he made in business and other ventures; also the income that his money and property earned."

TINY TOWN FORCES ULSTER BLOCKADE

DUBLIN, Feb. 5.—Tuam, a little town of 3000 inhabitants in County Galway on the west coast of Ireland, is the pioneer in the "economic blockade of Ulster" plan which the Sinn Féiners are advocating to force the Ulsterites into political submission.

The originators of the economic pressure scheme planned to hold it over the head of Ulster as a threat until the crisis on the home rule bill, but headstrong Tuam refused to wait. So a large number of merchants of Tuam have started to sever commercial relations with the North. And the powerful Ulster business interests are beginning to realize how serious such a "blockade" would be if it becomes general throughout the south.

In the first week of economic warfare one Belfast traveling salesman had twenty-three long standing accounts closed by Tuam merchants, a number as high as \$75,000 per year, while the total of the cancelled accounts aggregated over a quarter of a million dollars. Meanwhile the salesman failed to book a single order.

Although Tuam's trade does not "cut much ice" in Belfast, the incident has aroused the apprehensions of the big business interests of the northern metropolis, and shown them the serious possibilities of a general extension of the boycott.

The advocates of the scheme declare that in case it becomes necessary to extend the boycott to other towns, the people will be called upon to boycott any stores that refuse to fall in line with the blockade.

They assert that more than twenty-five per cent of Belfast's trade is distributed through and that such a boycott would hit Belfast a heavy blow. They are convinced that the business men would go to almost any lengths to avoid the extension to other cities.

M'ADOO AND HARDING ADDRESS 20 REPUBLICS AT FINANCIAL CONGRESS
