Commissioners Go to Milton.
The county commissioners and Roadmaster Phelps left this morning for Milton, Oregon, to view roads in the east end. They went as far as Weston on Monday.

A marriage license was issued by the county clerk today to George E. Baltesore and Mrs. Mary E. Whitehead, both of Pendleton.

Indian Woman Sues.
Annie H. Johnson today filed suit for divorce from Frank E. Johnson, alleging that he has recently been associating with another Indian woman near Cayuse. The couple was married on June 14, 1919. The plaintiff seeks \$50 monthly during pendency of the suit, \$100 attorney fees and \$50 a month alimony. She also asks restoration of her maiden name, Annie Hair. F. E. Schmidt and J. B. Perry are her attorneys.

YUMSUMKIN TO CARRY REQUESTS TO CAPITOL

To protest against the present system of sale of Indian lands and also against taxation, Yumsumkin, one of the head men of the Umatilla reservation, departed on the Northern Pacific train this afternoon for Washington, D. C., to personally confer with Cato Sells, commissioner of Indian affairs. He will be joined at Pasco by a friend from the Yakima reservation on the same mission. The Indians are selling their lands under the present arrangement, Yumsumkin says, and then spending all their money. The outcome is that they will soon find themselves with neither land nor money. It is his intention to have the sale of Indian land stop and allow the Indians, instead, to rent exclusively. He wants them to have more to say about terms and conditions of rental as well.

Yumsumkin is one of the prominent Indians of the council but is going not as their representative but as an individual. He expects to stay a month or more.

REVIVALIST GAVE TIME FOR ARMENIAN APPEAL

When B. F. Irvine, editor of the Portland Journal, began his address last evening at the First Christian church a splendid representative Pendleton audience greeted him. The eloquent journalist held the people's closest attention for 45 minutes, as he set forth conditions now prevailing in stricken Armenia. There is no longer any doubt about Umatilla county doing her part to send relief to the near east since Mr. Irvine's visit. Senator R. W. Rittner, the chairman of the county organization which will engineer the drive, was present at the meeting and introduced the speaker in appropriate words. At the conclusion of the appeal for Armenia, Evangelist Wilhite delivered a brief sermon on "Our God a Jealous God."
