Fix Brothers Get Judgment
Judgment in the sum of \$87, with interest from July 1, 1917, and costs of suit, was given Leo L. Fix and C. J. Fix against Dan C. Gibson and George Halley in circuit court today.

Judge Decides on Verdict
A judgment of the circuit court, filed today, upholds the amended verdict of the January circuit court jury in the case of S. Metz & Sons vs. W. I. Ebbert, and gives the defendant \$22 and costs. The verdict was returned by the jury at first was declared by them to be ambiguous and the judgment today upholds the letter and spirit of their meaning. By the original verdict as interpreted, the defendant was given a judgment of more than \$1,700.

Pilot Rock School Honored
A certificate was sent to school district No. 1 at Pilot Rock today showing that its grade school is a school auxiliary of the American Red Cross with a 100 per cent membership. The certificates are sent out by the county superintendent of schools.

Title to a parcel of land in section 2 township 5 north, range 25 east was given in fee simple today to Frank Sullivan by decree of the circuit court. He recently brought suit against Charles Crossman et al. to clear the title.

Defendant Gets Divorce
A decree of divorce was granted the defendant today in the case of Henrietta Metzger vs. James A. Metzger. The defendant filed a cross-complaint which was not contested by the plaintiff.

McDonald Estate Admitted
The estate of the late Harry Orlando McDonald was admitted to probate today and Alton W. Knotts appointed administrator. W. W. Wegner, Arthur Osborn and Frank Jordan were named appraisers.

HAWAIIAN JAPANESE SEEK CITIZENSHIP

HONOLULU, T. H., Feb. 14.—Every Japanese pupil born in Hawaii and enrolled in grades 5, 6, 7 and 8 of the public schools of North Kohala, island of Hawaii, has declared his intention to become an American citizen, according to the report of Bertha Ben Taylor, supervising principal.

It also was announced that the children all had made their declarations with the consent of their parents, and that the Japanese consul-general at Honolulu had been asked to take the steps necessary to have them released from all allegiance to the Japanese emperor.

In this connection the Japanese-American resident of the islands recently petitioned the Japanese government to release them from the control of the Japanese dual citizenship laws, and sent a request to President Wilson that he also bring their desires to the attention of the government at Tokyo.

STOLEN LIBERTY BONDS AND STAMPS WORTH MILLIONS ARE HELD

Stolen registered Liberty bonds and War Savings Stamps amounting in value to several million dollars, recovered by the United States secret service in a nation-wide cleanup of fake brokers' establishments, are to be restored to their rightful owners by the treasury department, it is announced. Most of the securities seized previously had been recorded as lost or stolen. Treasury officials say raids have reached the point of a successful roundup of the chief violators.
