IDAHO CARPENTER WINS PART IN \$750,000 ESTATE AFTER SIX YEARS FIGHT

POCATELLO, Idaho, Feb. 19.—John R. Wilson, a carpenter of this city, has received information from his brother in Chicago that, after six years of litigation, they have established their claim to an estate in England which will net each approximately \$750,000. One hundred and eleven years ago a great grandfather left his estate in London to the city, to be used for 99 years. The deed expired 12 years ago and the heirs have been sought all over the world. For a time the brothers paid no attention to the rumors that they were heirs.

HITCHCOCK'S SUITE SAVES GLASS FROM "CURBSTONE"

WASHINGTON, Feb. 19.—The senate office building was constructed to house 96 senators. But for all that when Carter Glass was sworn in the other day as a senator from Virginia, there was no office for him. Carter's Virginia temper expressed itself at once.

LABOR WILL COMBAT ESCH-CUMMINS BILL

WASHINGTON, Feb. 19.—Labor today decided to fight the Esch-Cummins bill providing for regulation of railroads after their return to owners March 1. While this decision was being reached at the American Federation of Labor headquarters here, railroad executives were meeting with Rail Director Hines, discussing wages and other problems connected with the return of railroads.
Labor's opposition to the railroad bill will be set forth in a letter to President Wilson, signed by President Gompers of the federation, it is learned. Labor leaders called the bill a "hodge-podge" despite the fact that it establishes tribunals for wage disputes minus any compulsory feature. One clause, however, provided for introduction of wage disputes before these tribunals through petitions by 100 "unorganized" employees. This, leaders say, is a discrimination against organized labor.

173,911 HUNTED FOR DRAFT DESERTION

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18.—The war department today announced that a round-up of wilful draft deserters will be started immediately. There are 173,911 listed. They will be vigorously prosecuted, it is stated.

The list of draft deserters will be published, either in whole or locally in sections for information of the department of justice and local police, it was announced. Registrants who failed to obey injunction orders or to enter for mobilization camp, but subsequently served honorably in the army, navy or marine corps before the armistice will be relieved of the charge of draft desertion.

82 SHIPS BUILT FOR FRANCE, UNSEAWORTHY

PARIS, Feb. 20.—Of eighty-two ships built for France by the United States during the war not one has been able to put to sea, because it was built of unseasoned and defective lumber. Under Secretary of State Bignon told the chamber of deputies commission on merchant marine yesterday. Bignon said the ships cost France \$80,000,000.

The commission ordered an investigation.
Private Firms Responsible
WASHINGTON, Feb. 20.—Wooden vessels constructed for the French government in this country were built by private firms, contrary to the shipping board's advice. It was stated at the shipping board today. The board, it was said, had nothing to do with construction of the vessels and sold no ships of any kind to France.
