Eugene and Junction City high schools in Latah county gave notice yesterday of their withdrawal and Myrtle Creek, in Douglas county, dropped out last week.

PORTLAND'S POPULATION 320,656 SAYS ESTIMATE

PORTLAND, Feb. 25.—Portland's population is 320,656, according to an approximate estimate made by the R. L. Polk Co., as a result of their annual canvass of the city and its environs, in connection with the compilation of the Portland city directory.

The actual number of names listed in this year's edition of the directory is 142,514 and from this the city's population is estimated by multiplying this total by 2.14, a factor determined after years of experience in city directory work.

This multiplying factor takes into consideration the names of women and children under 15 years of age, not listed in the directory. The report is issued by H. T. Hutchinson, local manager for Polk & Co.

ARMY AVIATOR ASKS PERMISSION TO TRY 1-DAY COAST FLIGHT

SEATTLE, Wash., Feb. 25.—Permission to attempt a one-day flight between Seattle and San Diego, approximately 1200 miles, has been requested by the war department by Major A. D. Smith, United States army aviator. It was announced here today. Major Smith, if the permission is granted, will leave here Friday or Saturday of this week. He will get away at daybreak and make his first stop at Eugene, Ore., for supplies. From Eugene he will fly to Red Bluff before stopping again. His other California stops will be San Francisco, Fresno and possibly Riverside. It was said.

GIRL COCAINE PEDDLER SAYS TRAFFIC IS SIMPLE

MISSOULA, Mont., Feb. 25.—Gertrude Fisher, young in years but old in the ways of the world, sat in the office of Sheriff Green today and told a reporter just how easy it is in Spokane at least, to get that white powder known to the underworld as "snow" and to the medical world as cocaine.

Mrs. Fisher has been held for more than a month. In fact, she said today was her 32d day in the county jail, and she said that every day was a week. She was arrested with a girl named Ethel Parker at St. Ignace, where in company with two men, it was said they were selling cocaine.

"It's mighty easy to get 'snow' in Spokane," the girl said. "All I used to do was to go to the phone and call up a messenger service near Victoria hotel and say, 'This is Babe.' In about five minutes a messenger boy would bring me the dope. Sometimes I'd call from my room and sometimes from a restaurant. And then other times I'd go into the messengers' office and they'd send somebody out in the back office and bring it to me."

"That service wasn't the only place I could get it, though. I used to call two others there and they'd bring it to me just as quick."

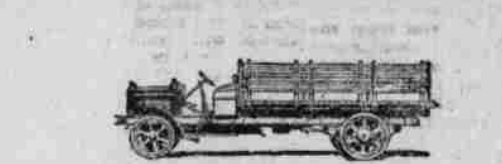
