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## HAS THE TIME ARRIVED?

IT IS not an easy thing to provide a wholly satisfactory city government under the councilmanic plan. The councilmen are not paid. Having their own affairs to attend to there is a limit to the time they can devote to the city's business. Responsibility is not well defined and affairs run along on a more or less haphazard basis.

There are many who feel that the time is at hand for commission government in Pendleton. A city commission usually works through a city executive called the manager and who is selected on his merits as a man who can obtain efficient results. Many present local shortcomings could be eliminated by adopting the commission plan and by placing detailed responsibility with a capable manager, backed by a board chosen from the city at large and not by wards.

IF THE mothers of America but knew of the plight of the Armenian children there would be no question about the success of the relief fund. More than 40,000 little tots are in orphanages in that unhappy district and 100,000 more would be there if the orphanages had room for them. 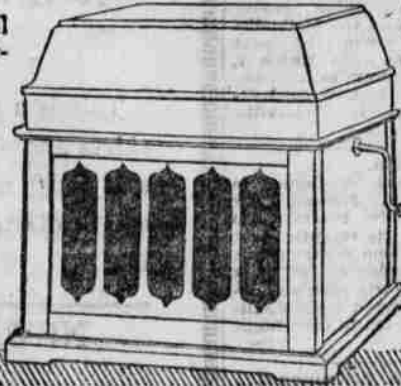
