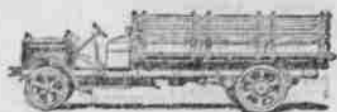

LLOYD GEORGE COMPETES IN ECCENTRIC HEADGEAR

LONDON, March 1.—Lloyd George has challenged Winston Churchill's monopoly of eccentric headgear. It is a magnificent challenge and when the prime minister emerged from 10 Downing street wearing it, crowns flocked round him. BEND, March 1.—At the close of a conference held Wednesday in Redmond between George L. Burt, owner of large tracts of potato lands in Central Oregon and representative Deschutes county ranchers and business men, a contract was signed in which Mr. Burt agreed to employ no more than three Japanese on the Burt ranch in the Lower Bridge section and a like number on the lands owned in the Powell Butte country. The Japanese to be so employed will be retained in the capacity of experts and will be engaged only during the potato season.
