VOTE EXPECTED TO DRAW FINAL LINES ON PACT

Lodge Presents New Substitute for Reservation to Article 10 and Measure Will Likely Establish Forces.

REJECTION OF TREATY ON LAST ROLL CALL FORECAST

Proposal Provides United States Will Not Interfere in Foreign Controversies Whether Referred to or Not.

WASHINGTON, March 13.—A vote on the Lodge substitute for the reservation to Article 10 is expected to clearly draw lines which will stand through the final ratification vote.

A democratic poll in the senate today forecast the adoption of the Lodge substitute by a safe majority and the rejection of the treaty on final roll call.

PARENT TEACHERS SCOT

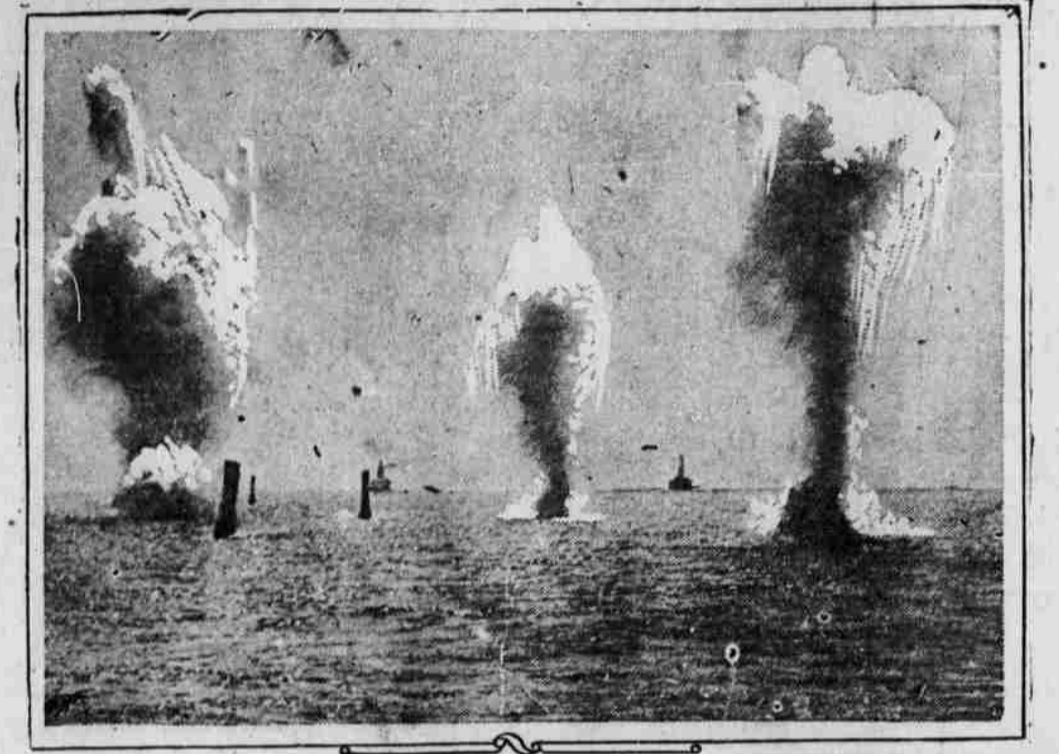

Startling facts relating to the critical situation that confronts the agricultural college, the state university and Monmouth normal school were given here last evening by President W. J. Kerr who failed at a meeting of O. A. C. alumni, the library and other in the evening to small group of businessmen at the Hotel Pendleton.

"The income for the state university in 1919 was only \$14,846 more than in 1918 while attendance at that school increased from 691 to 1,745; the income for the agricultural college has increased \$14,462 during that period and the attendance at the school has increased from 1264 in 1917 to 4478 at this time," said the speaker.
