SEVEN TROPHIES AND 400 TARGETS PUT UP FOR LEWISTON SHOOT

Annual Event Next Month Will
Call Shooters From All Over
Three States; \$700 in Added
Money Offered.

Seven trophies at 25 targets each and 400 in all, will be shot at the Inland Empire trapshoot of the Lewiston Rod Gun on April 25, 26 and 27, programs just received in Pendleton show. In addition, persons shooting through the entire program will be eligible to four prizes given by the club for high gun, second high gun, low gun and second low gun. Sunday, April 25, will be practice day, with five 20-bird events, shooting

for the Langan trophy, C. S. Butler trophy and the Tamblin trophy, each of 25 birds. The first day of the actual shoot is Monday when 10 events of 15 registered targets each will be shot, followed by the R. C. Beach and Elk trophy shoots of 25 birds each. On Tuesday the 150 registered targets will be shot at as well as the Akers and Ulrich trophies. The latter is for three man teams.

The Butler money-back system will govern the shoot and in addition there will be \$700 in added money. Shooters from Oregon, Idaho and Washington have been extended invitations to attend and it is probable that the Pendleton Rod & Gun Club will send its quota, several having attended the Lewiston shoot last year.

WALLA WALLA SPORTS TAKE 20 RINGSIDE AND ATHENA 21 FOR BOUTS

Seats Nearly All Sold for Close-
Up of Boxing Smoker; Train-

Twenty ringside seats for the American Legion boxing smoker have been sold in Walla Walla this week and Athena sportsmen have purchased 21, according to L. G. Rice, who has charge of the seat sales for the big event in Happy Canyon on the night of April 19. At least 50 from Walla Walla are expected to attend and root for their favorite, Gene Bartell, who is boxing Buddy Stevens in the eight-round semi-windup.

Kingside seats have virtually all been sold in Pendleton and vicinity and reservations can be made on Saturday at either the Charles Company or the Cozy Billiard Parlors on Main street.

The hot showers will round out the equipment necessary for training and probably several of the boys will take up work here. Johnny Noye, headliner, is expected to leave St. Paul shortly to prepare for his bout with Harry Casey. Casey is keeping in trim in Seattle by training and an occasional match.

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AMERICAN SCULPTOR STARTLES LONDON

LONDON, April 1.—Jacob Epstein, American sculptor, has set London talking by the exhibition of his statue of the risen Christ.

The Savior is represented by a more than life sized stone figure, bearing the wrappings of the tomb. The arms are free and the right hand is held upon a level with the breast while the left hand points to the wound in the palm caused by a nail of the crucifixion.

The body is slender and unaccentuated, and the effect of slenderness is intensified by the long line of a portion of the grave clothes hanging from the right arm to the ground.

The face is strange, grave and dignified, with a small chin, a high

ridged but delicate nose and the suggestion of a beard. The head is square and high, poised strongly upon a slim, straight neck.

There is nothing of the conventional softness of feature so general in the Italian representation of the Christ.

"The head is not a radical head, it is neither Jewish or European. All the Italian Christs had something of humanity in them, something universal. That is what I have aimed at, to picture Christ first of all a man."

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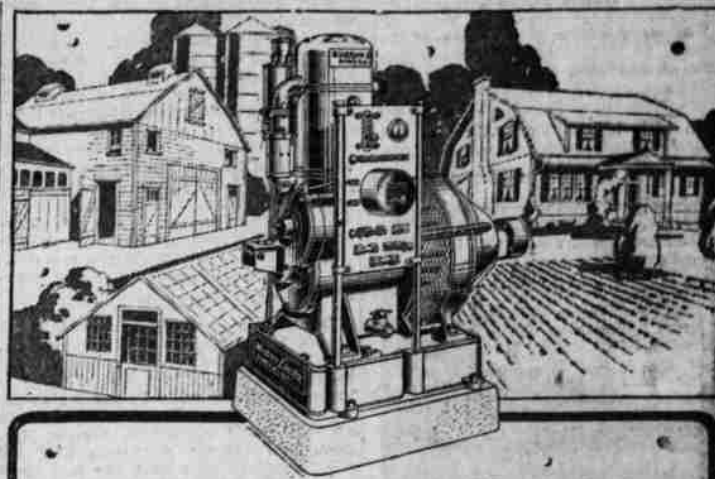
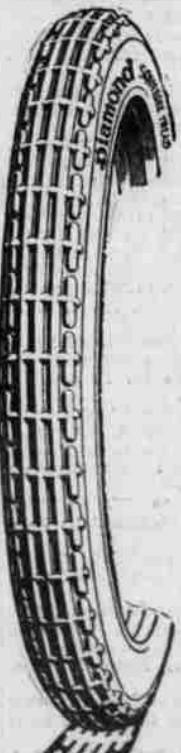
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
