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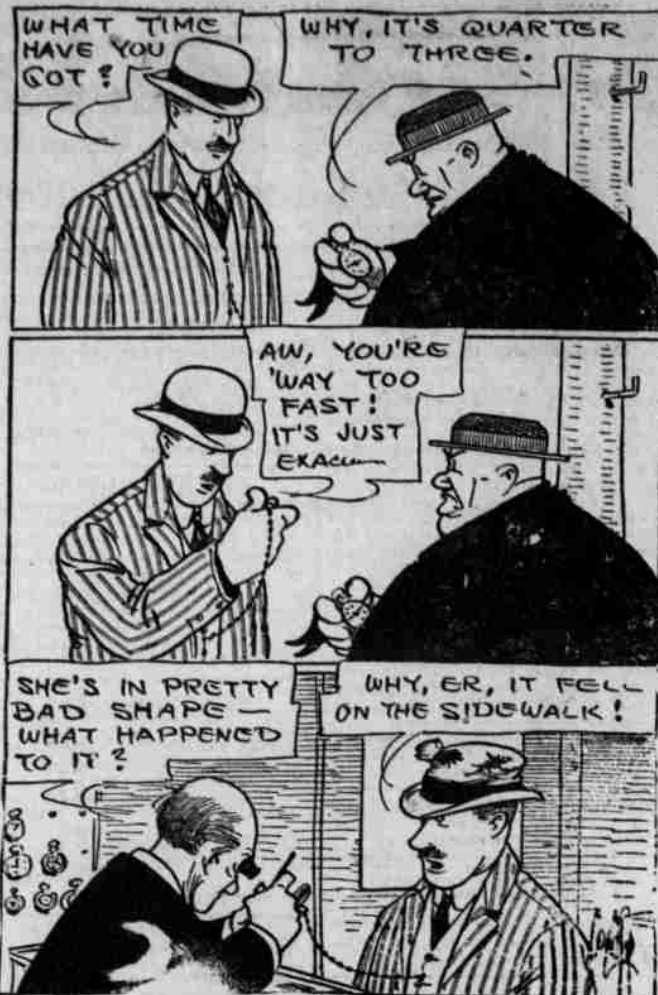

Corn Takes Sharp Drop at Strike News.
(By Associated Press.)
CHICAGO, April 13.—Corn prices underwent a sharp setback at one time today as a result of optimistic current in some quarters that the end of the strike was at hand. The market closed nervous, at the same as Saturday's finish to 1 1/8c lower with May 1.67@1.67 1/8; and July 1.59 3/4 to \$1.60. Oats lost 1/4c to 1 3/8c. In provisions the outcome varied from 17c decline to 15c advance. Receipts were scanty and a majority of traders leaned to the view that demoralized traffic conditions would for the time being prevent any accumulation of stocks. Price bulges that ensued reached in some cases the highest level yet this season.

Oats weakened with corn after jumping to new high record figures. Provisions were governed chiefly by the action of grain.

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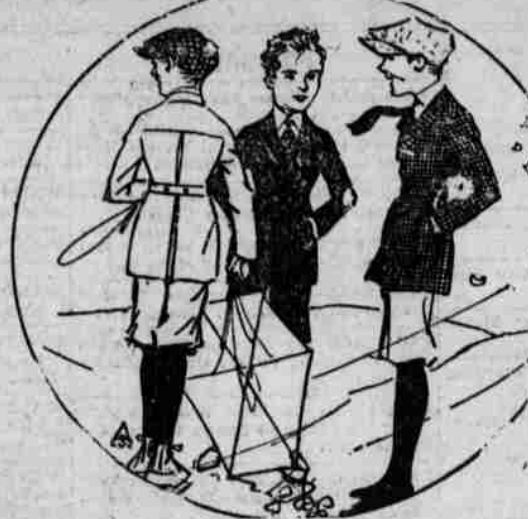

Wheat and Flour Export Totals 151,181,000 Bushels.
Exports of wheat and flour July 1, 1919 to April 2, 1920, amount to 91,559,000 bushels of flour, making a total equal to 151,181,000 bushels of wheat compared with 131,988,000 bushels of flour last year to April 2, 1919, the first two days of April being prorated from the monthly total which makes a total of 221,366,000 bushels of wheat. Last year's total flour exports include American Relief administration and American Expeditionary shipments.

Winter Wheat in Country Placed at 83 Per Cent.
A summary of crop conditions on April 1, compiled by the department of agriculture in Oregon, gives the winter wheat crop in Umatilla county a condition of 83 per cent. Morrow county is listed at 100 per cent and Union county at 92 per cent. The condition of rye in this county is not estimated. The supply of farm labor as compared with last year in this county is 105 per cent but only 45 per cent of normal. The demand for farm labor is also 105 per cent as compared to last year and compared with normal is 100 per cent.

Hides and Wool Unchanged at N. Y.

Portland Corn Follows Eastern Lead and Goes Up.
Corn in the Portland market yesterday took a sudden jump upward, with a bid of \$2.87 a ton for immediate delivery. This was in keeping with a higher price bid on the Chicago exchange, due to reports that the strike of switchmen was breaking up. Other corn, for future shipment, is at \$4. Oats are bid at \$6 and \$6 1/2 a ton and mill feed at \$40.50.

Potatoes Scar and Vegetable Is Scarce.
Potatoes are now selling at \$8 a hundred, wholesale price. The vegetable is hard to get and some local stores are out. It is probable that a shipment will arrive tomorrow. Spauld and Yakima markets are almost cleaned out and Portland will ship only 10 sacks to a retail dealer. Some local stores are getting the vegetable from Weston Mountains.

Price of Chickens Now 28 Cents.
The buying price of chickens, live weight, is 25 cents. The fowls retail for 40 cents a pound, dressed.
