At the outset the corn trade was confronted with a big accumulation of overnight selling orders and with a renewal of weakness in the New York stock market. During the consequent tumult when business began in the corn pit, an extreme fall of six cents a bushel took place with simultaneous dealings fully three cents apart among different sets of brokers. It soon grew apparent, however, that there was to be no further stampede, and that many commission houses had turned to the buying side. This was especially the case after gossip became current that European demand for wheat and rye showed excellent volume.

Oats showed considerable independent power to rally. Severe declines in the hog market kept provisions mostly on the down-grade. Lard touched the lowest price this season.

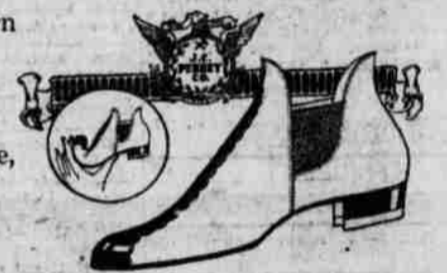
