## COUNTIES SOAR OVER TOP IN S. A. DRIVE

PORTLAND, May 13.—(Special.)—Reports reaching headquarters slowly from outlying points in the state show several additional counties over the top in the Salvation Army drive and the majority of the state outside of Portland is working hard to wind up the campaign for funds with which to finance the state-wide home service program for 1920. There are but one or two laggard counties. In these the quotas will be reached but not by the time limit set for final report.

Union county is cleaning up the small pledges, but is over the top. Wheeler county is over the top. Deschutes county reports nearing quota. Hood River is launching its final cleanup. Crook county reports finish in sight. Baker county is 80 per cent through and cleaning up. Lake county expects to finish Thursday.

Marshfield is leading the Coos county race with \$1500 in hand from the city alone. In Yamhill county Newberg is over its quota and the Newberg district closed up.

The American Legion boys have taken over the Tillamook drive and according to President Campbell are putting it over.

Folk county expects to report over plus tomorrow. Benson county is over half through and expects to make a quick finish. Marion county has over \$10,000 in hand and expects to clean up its quota Thursday.

John Letheridge, state drive president, declares that with very few exceptions the counties out in the state will be over the top by the end of the week. Many have the money in hand but reports from isolated districts are coming in slowly, he says. "I look for the drive to be a big success and for the majority of the counties to go over plus," he declared.

**IN TERMS OF INVESTMENT**

**E**DUCATION, just as capital, pays interest when invested and counts as an economic loss when it is allowed to lie idle. There is a legal rate of interest and usually a set percentage of profit in capital, but education returns are unlimited. A dollar invested in a venture may at best return 25 per cent, but a dollar invested in education can quickly double itself.

Take the youth from school after he has completed the grammar grades, let him work for the rest of his life and he will produce, on the average, \$750 a year. Give him the four years of high school and he will produce \$1250 a year, or 66 2/3 per cent more. Give him a technical or professional training, such as four years in a college or university, and his producing power is \$2100 a year, or 70 per cent more for the added four years.

Or take, if you will, \$1.26 out of every \$1000 on which you pay taxes. Is there any place it can be invested to give a greater return than for educating young men and women to properly teach the growing generation? Is there any place it will, in four years, increase by 70 per cent the producing power of a young man or woman for the rest of his or her life? The higher educational relief bill asks for that \$1.26 now so that Oregon may have \$2100 citizens next year and for years to come instead of \$1250 citizens.

**THE FOREIGN TRADE CONVENTION**

**T**WO thousand of the world's greatest businessmen, America's bankers and foreign trade directors, are assembled this week end in San Francisco in one of the most noteworthy gatherings of its kind on the western hemisphere. Leaders in commerce from all over the Americas are there to work for the further spread of American commerce into the undeveloped foreign fields of the world.

The assembly recalls with what rapidity the United States has forged ahead in foreign commerce. Before the war the balance of trade was heavily against the United States in the matter of exports. The United States shipped the small share of its world commerce chiefly in foreign bottoms. Today the United States is playing a very important part in feeding the world as well as furnishing it many of the necessities in the development line. It has something of a merchant marine, with possibilities of a much greater fleet.

The United States' phenomenal rise in the industrial and financial world since the war began five and a half years ago has been due in a measure to the stimulant of foreign trade. The possibilities of this field have been seen as never before. On the Pacific coast, especially, can the field of expansion be clearly seen. It is fitting, therefore, that San Francisco be the scene of this convention. The good results of the gathering cannot help but be far reaching.
