MOSCOW, Ida., May 15.—Lewiston high school, with 59 points, yesterday won the inter-scholastic track meet held under the auspices of the University of Idaho. Burley was second with 53 points and Genesee third with 18. Wesley Don of Burley won individual honors by taking four firsts. Don, who yesterday equalled the national record of 5-2.5 seconds for the 50-yard dash, won the final today in 5-4-5. He also won the 200-yard dash, the 100-yard dash and the broad jump.
