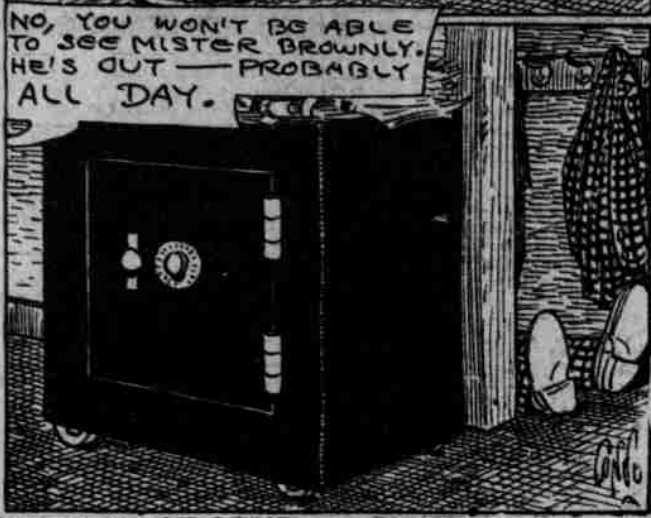

SPOKANE, May 21.—The reduction of 10 to 20 per cent in lumber prices announced February 24 by the Weyerhaeuser Sales company of this city, controlling the output of a number of mills in the northwest, will be continued until September 1, it was announced here today by J. N. Tate, assistant general manager of the company. Slight adjustments, he said, had been made in the prices of products of Idaho mills, but the average had been maintained.

Manufacturers' representatives at the sale told of the return of goods to the mills in many cases, principally woolens, of cancellations of other orders new in the 1000s and of consequent curtailments already under way. Some plants have discontinued overtime work. Others have suspended night operations and a few have reduced work to four or five days a week. It was stated, however, that a radical curtailment or shutdown of plants was not considered imminent.
